Dear St. Thomas Family,



"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven" Ecclesiastes 3:1

It does not seem possible that I have been serving as your Vicar at St. Thomas for almost five months. I feel so blessed that you called me to be your Interim Pastor. I have loved getting to know you, as members of this congregation, and the wealthy history of this church. We have had time to worship and share in fellowship together. We have worked together and prayed together. The question frequently asked is, "How long you will be here and when will we get a permanent priest?" I wish I could give you a definitive answer but there are many variables that makes it difficult for me

to give it at this time. What I do know is that everything happens in "God's perfect timing." It takes patience to wait for God's timing. Yet, during this period there is still work that we need to do together.

When I was called, I was asked to sign a Letter of Agreement for two years which I did with the understanding that it could be extended if needed. To do this takes time, along with the ability and the willingness of the members to change. Change is not always easy. Our progress may be slow, but it needs to be steady.

Your role in this growth is not only needed but is crucial for progress. You may be asked to serve on various subcommittees needed for achieving the goals.

This is an exciting time for our parish. Together we will discover what God is calling us to be as an active and creative congregation serving in ministries that support the spiritual and physical work in God's church. I will be here to support and work with you as long as I am needed, and the Bishop agrees. At the Bishop's Committee meeting of April 10th, the group reviewed their current list of goals for the future improvement of our facilities and operations here at St. Thomas.

Goal 1: We are considering creating areas in our chapel and main sanctuary to accommodate handicapped persons in wheelchairs satisfactorily.

Goal 2: We are working to correct the current deficiencies in lighting in the main church. We are having difficulty in finding a company with the equipment to do the work in the high places in the sanctuary, so we may have to revert to our own scaffolding and personnel.

Goal 3: Brick work repair on the front of the church, which will cost at least \$40,000.

Goal 4: Reviewing our By-laws and updating as needed.

Goal 5: Reviewing and updating our office technology.

There is a basket at the back door to our church for you items.
