#### Love

It's February and LOVE is in the air! Yes, some of you are making a note right now to purchase a card or other token of love for someone in your life as Valentine's Day is fast approaching.

To love and to be loved are integral parts of how God has created us. We are made for relationships, both with God and with others. When asked by the Pharisees to name the greatest commandment, Jesus responded, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:37-40 ESV) Through Jesus, we see more clearly how it looks to love God and to love others.

This month we have an unusual opportunity to consider what loving God and loving others requires. On February 14, we will simultaneously celebrate love on Valentine's Day AND acknowledge our sinfulness and mortality as we observe Ash Wednesday. At first glance, these may appear to be very different or even opposite kinds of observances. However, upon closer examination, I would suggest that our ability to love God and others begins with an acknowledgment of our sinfulness and mortality, thus leading us to the realization that it is only through God's grace that we can move beyond our human condition to a place where we can receive God's love and then share it with others.

As we travel through Ash Wednesday/Valentine's Day and on into the Lenten season, we will explore together different aspects of God's amazing love. Through the Old Testament lectionary readings for these weeks, we will consider God's faithfulness, generosity, holiness, graciousness, and patience.

Are these also words that describe your love for God and others? Do they name some ways in which you need to grow in love? How is God shaping you into a more loving person?

I look forward to exploring these questions with you in worship this month.

Dale Edgerley' Pest Control won the bid for extermination of pests and termite treatment for both the parsonage and church buildings. Combining the services and changing exterminators reduced the total bill.

The Sanctuary porch will be sand-blasted and repainted. This is at no cost to us, since the paint contractor assumes that responsibility.

Chairs with padding have been ordered for the former Social Hall. Those attending Bible Study and/or meetings will be more comfortable with these additions.

Another leak was repaired in the roof. Please consider giving part of your tithe to Capital Improvements. Those funds may be needed for further repairs to our church and parsonage.

Anne Watkin's former office has been designated for the Christmas Box project. The room will also be used for storage for seasonal decorations.

Please report to a Trustee anything that you believe needs to be addressed concerning the grounds and buildings. The committee members want St. Paul to be maintained properly.


