LOVE

Did you know that there are 792 references to <u>love in Scripture?</u>

In 1 John 4:8, we read, "The person who doesn't love does not know God, because God is love."

When Jesus was asked which commandment in the Law is the greatest he replied, "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your being, and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: You must love your neighbor as you love yourself. (Matthew 22:36-39)

How well do you love God and your neighbor? Do you love both the way that you love yourself?

Here is an exercise that I do from time to time to help me consider how well I am "loving" God, my neighbor, and myself. I invite you to try this exercise now.

- 1. Read 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 aloud.
- *Love is patient, love is kind, it isn't jealous, it doesn't brag, it isn't arrogant, sit isn't rude, it doesn't seek its own advantage, it isn't irritable, it doesn't keep a record of complaints, sit isn't happy with injustice, but it is happy with the truth. Love puts up with all things, trusts in all things, hopes for all things, endures all things.
- 2. Now, read the passage aloud again, but this time insert your name in place of the word "love" or the word "it" that refers to love. For example, I would read, "Susan is patient, Susan is kind, Susan isn't jealous, Susan doesn't brag, etc."
- 3. Did you perhaps recognize an area in which you need to grow in love? For me, I am reminded that I need to grow in the area of being patient as a way of loving God and my neighbor. But the good news is that the Holy Spirit is continuing to shape me and you into the image of God, and hopefully, the next time that I do this exercise, I will see some growth in my ability to love both God and others with *patience!*

May God's grace continue to shape you into God's image---Love in action.


