As we begin the month of July, I am reminded of the many transitions that occur in this month. It is a time of celebrating your ministry with one pastor and of preparing for future ministry with a new one. It is a time of moving farther away from one school year and closer to the next. July is a time when our schedules and routines often change, knowing that the "new normal" we will soon resume may differ somewhat from the "old normal" of this past year.

At the recent gathering of the South Carolina Annual Conference, Rev. Susan Leonard-Ray, the Anderson District Superintendent, reminded the body that the Christian Church, as a whole, is in a time of transition. Perhaps you have noticed changes in attitudes and behaviors about church over the past couple of decades. Indeed, the Church is right in the middle of a transition that seems to occur about every 500 years, according to author Phyllis Tickle. If you look back in 500 hundred year increments, you will see the Protestant Reformation of 1517, the Great East-West Schism of 1054, the fall of the Roman Empire around 590, and the birth of the Church 500 years before that. Currently, the Church is feeling the friction of another seismic shift as our modern institution seeks to serve in a post-modern world.

This brief history lesson is an attempt to say, "Fear not! We have been here before." Through each transition of culture and the Church, we have seen that the timeless message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ continues to transform lives and redeem our world. It is my prayer that together we will embrace this time of transition, and work in new and creative ways to find the "new normal" that communicates God's saving grace to a world in need.
