Focus on the Future

As I write this message, our Forward Focus Team has just met to begin a process that we will all be moving through over the next few months. You may be asking yourself at this moment, "Now, what is Forward Focus?" Glad you asked!

Forward Focus is a **process** of study and discernment of local church potential. It has been used successfully in other United Methodist conferences to help local churches determine a God-directed "next step forward" as they seek to make new disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of their community and the world.

Key participants in this process include:

<u>Prayer Team</u>: The success of this process will be greatly improved with continuous prayer for God to show us where God is working in our community and how we are to come alongside that work. I am asking each person in this congregation to pray over this process now and continuously until it is completed. We will be gathering to pray together on Sunday evenings starting September 10 at 5:30p.m.

<u>Forward Team</u>: a group of individuals from our congregation who will gather data about our church's mission, ministries, finances, attendance, and facilities. They will also gather data about who is in our community, and about the needs and services that are present there.

<u>Forward Leader</u>: A trained individual, assigned by our District Superintendent and Congregational Specialist, to serve as a coach for our Forward Focus Team. Rev. Dan Smyth, pastor of Cambridge UMC in Ninety Six, is serving as our Forward Leader.

<u>Church Congregational meetings</u>: These four meetings will be a time to share with the whole congregation the information that the Forward Team has gathered. This will be a time for additional input by the congregation and a time for asking questions. Our congregational meetings will be held in the **Family Life Center at 9:00a.m.** on the following Sundays: **September 24, October 29, November 26, and January 14**.

It is my prayer that each of you will participate in the Forward Focus process with your prayers and with your presence at all congregational meetings as we discern our God-directed "next step forward" in ministry to this community.

I pray that the eyes of your heart will have enough light to see what is the hope of God's call, what is the richness of God's glorious inheritance among helievers, and what is the overwhelming greatness of God's power that is working among us helievers."
