### PREOCCUPIED BY LOVE

John 13:34-35

"A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: <u>just as I have loved you</u>, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."



Our sermon series for August and September is "Preoccupied by Love". We have looked at Jesus' preoccupation, which was compassion for the troubled and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd (Matthew 9:35-38). We were challenged to pray with our eyes open so that we SEE the troubled and helpless around us and can offer a prayer, a word of hope, or a tangible offering to them to help meet their need. Our District Superintendent, Rev. Stephen Love, shared the story of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37) and reminded us of God's call to be compassionate, to draw near to the hurting, and to show mercy.

So, I ask you today, with what are you preoccupied? Is LOVE the driving force for your words and actions? Is your day centered around seeking ways to show LOVE? When people are in your presence, what do they feel radiating from you? When people are not in your presence, are you lifting them up in loving and affirming ways?

Or...do you find yourself offering words of criticism and judgment about others. Do you choose to talk more about people rather than talking to people? Are you more concerned with changing someone else's behavior than in becoming more loving in your own behavior? (Luke 6:42)

To be preoccupied by love is a discipline. It a choice to practice certain loving behaviors and to cease from practicing other unloving behaviors.

How loving will you choose to be today? Tomorrow? Will you choose to let love become your preoccupation?

For your sake and for the sake of those you are called to love, I pray that you will choose to be preoccupied by LOVE every day.

This event will be held at **100 S. Jefferson St.** Look for us at the picnic shelter. It is supported by the Saluda County Sheriff's Department and the Office of our Mayor.

Rev. Taylor wants to disable the guns and repurpose them in the Saluda community as gardening tools or artwork – almost literally playing out Isaiah 2:4: "...they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more."
