A Word from Pastor Tom

This morning I found myself humming over and over again that beautiful tune "I Want Jesus to Walk with Me," which Penny and Laura and Tom brought to our service on Sunday, January 31st. Many of you may know that this is a traditional African American spiritual, and humming the tune brought to mind other spirituals, such as "Go Down Moses" and "He Never Said a Mumblin' Word." What incredible courage, insight, and artistry there are in these songs. Slave masters tried to teach African Americans a religion that would make them accept their lot in life, a kind of anti-Christ Christianity. Instead, Jesus spoke through these enslaved peoples to proclaim a liberation of the captives, right in the midst of the songs they sang while doing forced labor on plantations. As theologian M. Shawn Copeland says, "Rooted in the experience of oppression

and suffering, this highly charged symbolic language is most fundamentally a language of joy and mysticism in the midst of survival and resistance." In the worst of circumstances, God showed up, precisely in the faith of those who had every right to despair. All I can do is be lost in wonder, love, and praise because of these brothers and sisters who continue to speak and sing to us today. As your February begins, pray a prayer of thanksgiving with me.




