

## **Upcoming Bible Study Courses**

- Pastor Bob is starting a Youth Bible Study today on the Gospel of Mark during the Sunday School hour in the Library from 10 – 10:30 a.m., each Sunday. The gospel of Mark is the shortest of the four gospels, but they will take several weeks to move through at a slow pace. All youth in the 7<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grade are welcome to attend.

# UMPIRES HONORED BY U.S. OPEN (from usopen.org)

For giving so much to the game they love, five US Open officials were honored by USTA Officiating on Monday. Held in Flushing Meadows each year, the USTA's annual umpire awards ceremony recognize those who serve tennis with distinction in their capacity as certified officials throughout the year.

This year's winners ranged in both age and experience, including Florida's Chase Urban, recipient of the Jack Stahr Award, which is given to an official who demonstrates great promise in his or her first three years as an Open official; to **Dessie Samuels**, a 30-plus-year veteran of US Open officiating, who earned the John T. McGovern Award–presented to a USTA-certified chair or line umpire with at least 10 years of service for outstanding contributions to the profession.

Samuels, a member of the first-ever women's tennis team at Texas A&M University, has also officiated at the Australian Open, Wimbledon, Davis Cup and Fed Cup, and several Olympic Games.

After being greeted by a standing ovation from her peers, the longtime USTA Pro Circuit supervisor told the assembled group-stepping up to address them with her trademark, 'Howdy, y'all,'-that if she could thank everyone who had a helping hand in her career, she would name each person in the room.

"I never in my wildest dreams thought I would ever be included in this prestigious group of officials. It's probably the biggest stage I've ever spoken in front of," the Texan said. "It's always important to be recognized by your peers, when they understand the work that you put in. We've all been there, we've all done it, but for them to appreciate all the effort, it's really, really nice."

Two of the longest-tenured annual USTA umpire honors, the McGovern Award has been presented each year to an American official at the US Open since 1949, while the Stahr Award has been presented since 1983.
