While Memorial Day is a civic holiday to remember our war dead, it is quite often also a holiday that celebrates abundant living. Pause for just a moment to consider the tension in these two activities.

Of course it is a good and joyful thing to gather with friends and family for fun and food and frivolity. I honestly don't think we celebrate life enough, quite frankly. To be a serviceperson in the Armed Forces requires great commitment and honor and great courage.
