A note from Pastor Garrett 12-26-20

First and foremost, the time came from the conference where we either request to stay on with our current appointment, or ask to be placed elsewhere, and I'm happy to say that I eagerly requested to stay with you all. I am very happy

to see that the feeling is mutual. In the note for reasons why we requested to stay, I wrote in big bold letters that I love this church and its people.
