## HONESTY IS THE BEST POLICY ACTS 5:1-11 / 12-29-19 / P.M.

Let's consider a few important truths about this story before we dive into it.

- 1. Their story stands in stark contrast to the generosity of the early Christians in Acts 4:32-37.
- 2. Chapter five begins with the word "Now" indicating that the story that follows is the opposite of the generosity recounted in chapter 4.
- 3. This story isn't the normative. It's an anomaly that isn't repeated anywhere else in the N.T.
- 4. This story strongly parallels the story in Joshua 7 concerning a man named Achan.
- 5. This story is Satan's attack on the fledgling church from within.

## I. THEIR INFAMOUS STORY.

- A. What was their sin? 5:1-4.
  - 1. They loved money more than God or their church—1 Tim. 6:10.
  - 2. They wanted to appear to be more generous than they were.
  - 3. They not only lied to Peter, they lied to God.
- B. Their Judgment—5:5-10.
  - 1. Peter wasn't responsible for their judgment.
  - 2. God was.
- C. The Reaction of the People—5:5b and 11.

## II. THEIR LESSONS

- 1. God sees everything—Prov.15:3.
- 2. Lying is a sin—Prov. 12:22.
- 3. Greed is a sin—Ecc. 5:10.
- 4. We can hide our sins from others but not from God—Numbers 32:23.
- 5. Fear and reverence of God go hand in hand—Exo. 20:20, Prov. 1:7.
- 6. God takes sin seriously, deadly serious—Isa 59:1-2 and Romans 1:18-19.
