I. FIRST, WHAT IS A CRISIS OF BELIEF?

- A. The word crisis comes from a Greek word that means “decision.”

- B. A “God-sized” assignment is something that only God can do.

- C. When you’re faced with a “God-sized” assignment what you do next reveals what you really believe about God—Matt. 19:21-22.

II. SECOND, WHY DO WE FACE A CRISIS OF BELIEF?

- A. A real encounter with God requires faith—Isa. 7:9; 2 Cor. 5:7; John 14:12 and Matt. 17:20.

- B. Faith isn’t just a concept—Heb. 11:6.

III. THIRD, HOW CAN WE FACE OR OVERCOME A CRISIS OF BELIEF?

- A. The only way to face a crisis of belief is to remember that “actions always speak louder than words.”—James 2:26.

- B. This means that faith requires action.
