WHY DID JESUS HAVE TO DIE? ROMANS 3:24-26 / 3-28-21 / SUN

I. FIRST, TO SATISFY THE WRATH OF GOD.

- A. This is what Romans 3:25a says....
 - 1. "Propitiation" means "to placate, appease, or reconcile."
 - 2. So it means that the death of Jesus turns away God's wrath against us.
- B. God's wrath isn't a popular subject.
 - 1. We are called to warn people like John the Baptist did--Luke 3:7.
 - 2. Why is God's wrath important? It's important because God's justice demands the ultimate <u>punishment</u> for sin-death.
- C. Why did God do it this way?

II. SECOND, TO DEMONSTRATE GOD'S JUSTICE.

- A. This is what Romans 3:25b says...
 - 1. "Forbearance" means to temporarily postpone something, like a debt.
 - 2. God "postponed" our punishment for sin.
 - 3. <u>Jesus</u> paid sin's penalty in our place.
- B. Since God is <u>holy</u>, He cannot allow sin to go unpunished.
 - 1. God's solution was to punish sin and still <u>love</u> sinners.
 - 2. God did this by sending His own Son to pay sin's penalty for us.

III. THIRD, TO JUSTIFY US.

- A. This is what Romans 3:24 says....
 - 1. The word "justified" means to declare or make someone righteous in the sight of God.
 - 2. The word "freely" means to be justified without doing anything on our part to deserve it.
- B. Over 200 years ago a man in England named William Cowper illustrated this truth in a familiar hymn--"There is a Fountain".
