## WHAT YOUR COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER WON'T TELL YOU Jeremiah 29:11 / 6-14-20 / AM

## I. FIRST, GOD HAS A <u>PERSONAL</u> PLAN FOR YOUR LIFE.

- A. God's first word to these exiles was that He hadn't <u>forgotten</u> their plight— "I know the plans I have for you."
- B. Jeremiah, though, assures the exiles, and us, that God is thinking about us.
  - 1. God has a very personal plan for each of us— "I know the plans..."
  - 2. It's a plan that is tailor-made for us— "...plans I have for you."
  - 3. It's a plan, though, that might be a little different than our own plans.
  - 4. A lesson for us here is that "When God bolts a door you want to go through, don't try to climb through a window because God has something else in mind for us—Phil. 2:13 confirms this truth.

## II. SECOND, GOD HAS A LONG-TERM PLAN FOR YOUR LIFE.

- A. God's plan for these exiles was to remain in Babylon for <u>70</u> years.
- B. What was Jeremiah telling these exiles and us?
  - 1. First, although we may be <u>short-sighted</u> and anxious to change things, God may not be
  - 2. Second, God's long-term plans for us are <u>better</u> than any short-term plans-"plans to prosper you and not to harm you."
  - 3. Third, God's plans aren't always easy to follow.

## III. THIRD, GOD HAS A WORTHWHILE PLAN FOR YOUR LIFE.

- A. After 70 years, God miraculously brought Israel back to the Promised Land, back to Israel, back <u>home</u>.
- B. What does this tells us about God's plans?
  - 1. First, God's plans are <u>better</u> than or plans— "plans to give you hope and a future."
  - 2. Second, God's plans are filled with <a href="https://example.com/hope">hope</a> even if it doesn't look like it—Romans 8:31.
