HOW TO PRAY FOR RESULTS MARK 10:46-52 / 7-1-20 / WED

I. FIRST, WE SHOULD ASK <u>IMMEDIATELY</u>.

- A. This is what Bartimaeus did—v.47.
- B. We do not ask immediately because we don't see prayer as our <u>first</u> option.
- C. Prayer, though, is asking <u>immediately</u> not as a last resort but as a first resort—I Thess. 5:17—"Pray continually".
- D. The question "Have you prayed about it?" is an important question to ask <u>ourselves</u> and not just someone else.

II. SECOND, WE SHOULD ASK REPEATEDLY.

- A. This is what Bartimaeus did—v. 48.
- B. The verbs "ask, seek, and knock", are translated in Greek as "<u>Keep</u> on asking, keep on seeking and keep on knocking."
 - 1. <u>Jesus</u> prayed the same prayer three times in the Garden.
 - 2. <u>Paul</u> prayed the same prayer three times for his thorn in the flesh to be removed.
 - 3. Paul challenges us to keep praying—Eph. 1:17 "I keep praying". Colossians 4:2 "Continue in prayer".
- C. We should keep on praying the same prayer until Jesus <u>answers</u> us or until He makes it obvious that His answer is <u>no</u>.

III. THIRD, WE SHOULD ASK SPECIFICALLY.

- A. This is what Bartimaeus did-v.51.
- B. Bartimaeus was very specific when Jesus asked him what you want.
