GOD'S PROTECTION PLAN GENESIS 15:1 / 9-2-20 / WED

- I. FIRST, NOTICE THE <u>REVELATION</u> OF GOD'S PROTECTION PLAN.
 - A. Who is speaking here in verse 15? "the word of the Lord".
 - 1. This is the Hebrew word "Jehovah".
 - 2. It's God's "proper name" or His "Holiest name".
 - B. When did God promise to protect Abram and also us? "After This" meaning chapter 14.
 - C. How did God visualize his protection of Abram and us? —"... I am your shield" ...
 - D. What did God mean by saying He is our shield?
 - 1. He is our protector, security, guardian, and defender.
 - 2. Other passages using the word shield—Psalms 3:3, 7:10, 28:7 and 33:20.
 - 3:3-- You, Lord, are a shield around me.
 - 7:10- My shield is God Most High.
 - 28:7- The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart trusts in him, and he helps me.
 - 33:20- We wait in hope for the Lord; he is our help and our shield.
- II. SECOND, NOTICE THE RESULT OF GOD'S PROTECTION PLAN.
 - A. Abraham was a fearful man.
 - 1. First, we see his fear when he moved to <u>Egypt</u> for a time with his wife Sarah—Gen. 12:11-13.
 - 2. Second, we see his fear as he thought he would have no <u>son</u> to follow him—Gen. 15:2.
 - B. Now, God <u>promises</u> Abraham that he has nothing to be afraid of—" **Do not be** afraid, Abram..."

III. THIRD, NOTICE THE REWARD OF GOD'S PROTECTION PLAN.

- A. God not only promised to be Abraham's shield, he also said he was his reward—"I am your shield, your very great reward'
 - 1. In chapter 14 Abraham had <u>refused</u> a reward for rescuing Lot and others who had been kidnapped—Gen. 14:21-23.
 - 2. The point God is now making is that <u>He</u> is Abraham's reward, a great reward!
 - 3. The word "reward" means "wages", "earnings", or the "victor's spoils"
- B. The meaning God may have intended here is "the reward for your faithfulness."
 - 1. <u>Abraham</u> displayed his faithfulness to God in verse 6—Genesis 15:6.
 - 2. The Apostle <u>Paul</u> would use Abraham's faithfulness as a picture of the need for our own—Romans 4:20-24.
