RECIPE FOR REVIVAL

2 Chron 7:14 / 9-9-18 / AM

- I. FIRST, THERE ARE THE PEOPLE OF REVIVAL ("IF MY PEOPLE...").
 - A. What does this imply?
 - 1. Revival begins with <u>God's</u> people.
 - 2. Revival is a grass roots' movement.
 - B. A <u>spiritual awakening</u> involves large numbers of people coming to God during a rather brief time.
 - C. Revival, however, occurs when the personal experience of <u>Christians</u> is renewed and revived.
- II. SECOND, THERE IS THE PRICE OF REVIVAL.
 - A. The first price of revival is our **pride** ("will humble themselves").
 - 1. Pride has always been the enemy of an encounter with God.
 - 2. Humility is the opposite of pride.
 - 3. Humility involves confessing our needs before God.
 - B. The second price of revival is **prayer** ("and pray").
 - 1. Prayerlessness is the first cousin of pride.
 - 2. Most of the great revivals of the past were preceded by prayer.
 - 3. This <u>requirement</u> for revival has not changed today--<u>Matthew 21:22</u>
 If you believe, you will receive whatever you ask for in prayer."
 - 4. How much have you and I <u>prayed</u> for revival?
 - C. The third price of revival is **perseverance** ("and seek my face").
 - 1. Revival doesn't happen by seeking revival but by seeking God.
 - 2. What does it mean to seek God's face? It means to cultivate a love relationship with God.
 - 3. Further, it means we must make the first move--James 4:8--...Come near to God and he will come near to you & Isa. 55:6-- Seek the Lord while he may be found; call on him while he is near.
 - 4. If you seek Him you'll find Him--Prov. 8:17

- D. The fourth price of revival is **purging** ("and turn from your wicked ways").
 - 1. The words of Rudolph Hess are a stark example of a refusal to repent—
 - 2. Repentance is always a requirement of revival.

III. THE <u>PROMISE</u> OF REVIVAL.

- A. "I will hear from heaven".
 - 1. Sin hinders our <u>prayers—Ps. 66:18-- If I had cherished sin in my</u> heart, the Lord would not have listened.
 - 2. Sin also <u>alienates</u> us from God—Isa. 59:1-- But your iniquities have separated you from your God; your sins have hidden his face from you, so that he will not hear
- B. "I will forgive their sins"--I John 1:9.
- C. "I will heal their land"—2 Chronicles 7:15.
