
HAITI 2018

Hope you all missed me, as always, I am glad to be home. I was in Haiti from January 13 till February 2. The temperature when I left was 11 degrees outside, and when I returned it was 11 degrees. 3 weeks is a long time to be gone but our group was able to get a lot done. My job was cooking and along with Anna Campbell from Kingston and we cooked for 35-40 hungry people every day. Not my favorite job, but I felt I had been prayed into it.

The group was able to finish 15 homes for families that had lost theirs 2 years ago. Many other works were going on at the same time. The families moving into their homes will start out with little to no furniture. Most sleep on cardboard on the floor. The families came and painted their own home while we were there and the bright jewel colors they chose could be seen miles away. A bright spot in the dessert surroundings. Our Haitian dishwasher was able to paint her house bright green. The only piece of furniture she has is a table that one of the men in camp made for her. She and her 4 children will finally have a roof over their head that they can call their own.

Thanks to all the people that gave me money or prayed for me while I was gone. No one was injured, we had enough food and no one became ill. These are all answers to prayers. There were quite a few critters, but they kept their distance.
