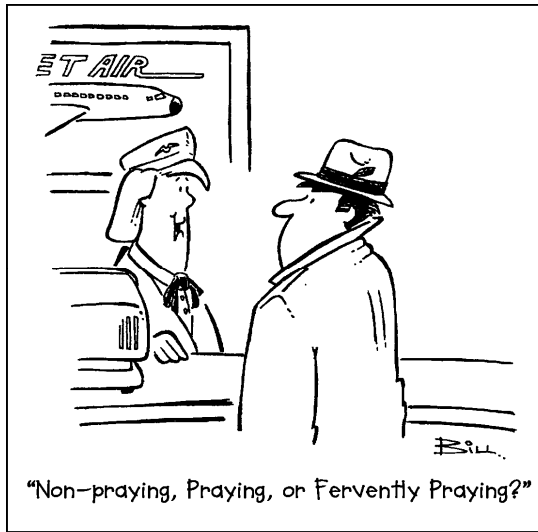

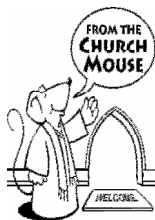

Tonight, (September 20th), we will be holding the initial meeting of our fourth ongoing Bible Study Group. This group is to meet at the home of the Terry Busker's northeast of Newtown. Since Terry is a deacon and interim pastor of the Ravanna Baptist church and some of his people also plan to be involved, we regard this as a cooperative mission endeavor between the two ministries, Ravanna Baptist Church and Medicine Valley.

Participation in the other three Home Bible Study Groups remains strong. The Newtown and Humphreys Groups are both approaching the final session of a doctrinal series on Heaven. A study utilizing the writings of the theologian and pastor, Randy Alcorn. Upon completion of these studies, both of these groups will begin a new series of studies entitled "*Defining and Activating a Christian World-view*". In these studies we will be utilizing study helps and DVD's from Brannon Howse, who conducts numerous weekend seminars on the Christian worldview, in various locations across the nation.

The Group at Reger is presently involved in a dual-segment study drawing from David Jeremiah's, "*What in the World is going on?*" and the studies on Heaven. These Bible Studies, while extremely time intensive, are well worth the time spent in study, preparation, teaching, and visitation. This appears for us to be our most effective means of reaching out to new people and involving them in meaningful study of God's word.

Our vision for ministry in our area includes expansion of Home Bible Study Groups from the present 3-4 to a total of 8 to 10 groups scattered throughout our area of ministry from north of Newtown to Humphreys and east to Reger. Our vision for ministry also includes working with our neighboring congregations; Alpha, Galt, Laredo, Rural Dale, Ravanna and First Baptist Milan, in all ways possible to reach the entire area for Christ.

In this regard, we hope to share in the development of a series of prayer meetings, throughout the year, culminating in the area-wide Evangelistic Crusade at Humphreys, scheduled for August 24-28, 2011. While concentrating our prayer and ministry efforts toward the people of this area and the ministry of these seven congregations, we are asking all churches in North Grand River Association to be supportive of our endeavor. Pastors can be of significant help simply by keeping our needs, objectives, and accomplishments, before their people. We are praying for a mighty outpouring of the power of the Spirit of God during the year, culminating with many brought to know Christ, both in our Medicine Valley Ministry area and in the surrounding communities. This will only happen if God's people who are called by His name will humble ourselves, seek His face, worship and serve Him, and truly be His people.

Perhaps we need to pause, before praying for the lost to be saved, and begin by praying for the renewal of the Church. May God forgive us for our indifference to the spiritual salvation of others. Perhaps if the church gets right with God then he will again bless our land, our children, and our children's children.

Last but not least, need I also mention, the ministry remains in need of additional financial support. We have been given a vision for a greatly enlarged ministry with accompanying greater financial needs. We accept the vision believing God will provide the necessary funds to under gird the enlarged work. We await the continued response of His people to the needs of this mission in your

MBC-BSU

This is the 5th week of school and God has given us some wonderful opportunities to prayer walk the campus, pray with students, have Bible studies with students, and 1 on 1 serious conversations about their relationship with Jesus Christ.

The Wed. Lunch ministry has seen a high number of 120 for lunch. The 4:30 Tues. Supper/Bible study has studied God's word with 9 regular students. The Thursday "Common Grounds" has given us opportunities to laugh and joke with students, and the Sunday Night Alive has brought us about 15 students each week for supper and Bible thoughts to discuss. Three of those students are a long way from their home in Louisiana. One other student comes to us from Africa. All 4 of them are experiencing a terrible bout of loneliness, that happens to us on a Sunday night, when we find ourselves so far away from home. God gives us the chance to pour His love into their lives with a home cooked meal and words of wisdom from His Word or show video clips of how powerfully God loves them.

This Wed. the BSU will be hosting SYATP on Geyer Hall lawn around the flag poles at 7:30am to pray for our faculty, staff, campus, town, and country. We will serve breakfast at 7am that morning in the basement of the mission center.

September 25th several of our students attended the Bethany Christian concert, with the purpose of working behind the scenes to make the event successful. And, also to take advantage of opportunities that God gives them to share their faith with concert goers who will be challenged to seek Jesus.

October 1-3, 2010 is our weekend Christian College Student "Get Away". We are praying that God will draw not only Christian students who need a break from classes to get alone with God but will also bring lost students who will be curious about God and ask who Jesus Christ is. Some of you have been very obedient to the Lord's urging and have contributed love gifts of \$80 and much more to help pay for one of our nights of motel rooms, help us with gasoline for the vans and food for the 6 meals we will feed the students during the weekend. Thank you so much. Most of our college students have very little and \$40 that I ask them to pay is out of the question for them. So, your financial love gifts really help the BSU take students who wouldn't otherwise be able to go, because of the cost. During this weekend the students are really challenged to consider Jesus in their lives and also challenged to share HIM with others on their campuses.

Continue to pray for our students. Ask God to send a spirit of **conviction** of our sin in our hearts. Pray that God will grant us the **gift of repentance** (Acts 11:18) in the hearts of our students as they are confronted with Jesus, and pray that God continues to give us **opportunities daily** to have conversations with students about their relationship with Jesus Christ (Acts 2).

Why is this an urgent request? Because you like me KNOW that time is short and souls are dying every second we waste. Pray and talk to people. A friend once made the comment, "How much do we have to **hate** someone NOT to share Jesus with them?" Do I hate people or do I love people?
