

Don't Keep the Bikes in the Shed

I went to Russia for the first time in 2014. One of the orphanages that we visited had received a special gift of some bikes from their sponsor. Pastor Reehl had delivered them himself to the orphanage a couple of weeks before we arrived. When we went to the orphanage, Pastor asked the kids how they liked the new bikes. The kids had a very puzzled look on their faces, and the director had an expression on her face that told us she knew that her secret had been exposed. We soon found out that she had put the bikes in the shed and locked the door to keep the bikes for a time later in the year. The bikes were out of the shed and the kids were riding them before we left that

day. The bicycles were no longer hidden away, but they were being used as the sponsor wanted them to be. The bikes weren't intended to be kept in the shed, they were to be used!

What do "bikes in a shed" have to do with you?

What gifts have you been given by God? (I'm not talking about material things here, although that could be a gift that you have received.) I'm talking about talents and interests. Maybe you are really good at working with kids or you're great with a sewing machine or you are a great cook or you're good at one (or more) of many other things. Are you using these God-given gifts or are you "keeping them in the shed", saving them to be used "someday"? God gave you gifts and He doesn't want you to lock them away. He wants you to use them to glorify Him and to help spread the news about God's love and about Jesus' death and resurrection!

We have to wonder about the logic of locking away a gift to keep it hidden. Bicycles locked in a storage shed seem ridiculous. Don't keep your gifts locked up, either. God gave you many gifts. Use them to His glory!

"Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone." (I Corinthians 12:4-6)



Official Call to 38th Biennial Convention

The Lutheran Women's Missionary League of Nebraska South District will meet in convention at the Younes Conference Center, Kearney, NE, September 17, 2016.

According to Article V, Section 2 of the District Bylaws, the voting body of the convention shall be two (2) certified delegates from each society, elected district officers, zone presidents and past district presidents who are currently members of the Nebraska South District LWML.

The credentials of the delegates shall be in the hands of the Recording Secretary at least two weeks prior to convention.



Money, Money, Money

"He who loves money will not be satisfied with money, nor he who loves wealth with his income; this also is vanity." (Ecclesiastes 5.10 ESV)

Money. Mammon. The root of all evil (1 Tim. 6:10). As I write this article, we are on the heels of the largest Powerball Lottery drawing in history: an estimated \$1.59 Billion payout. It is an unimaginable sum, and yet all kinds of people have been imagining what they would do should they win it. Who can imagine such a sum?

Pastors (and their Vicars) aren't immune from such monetary musings, either. (If I live another 50 years, I'd have to spend upwards of \$87,000 per DAY before I used it all up!) The picture attached to this article is the ticket of none other than yours truly. I walked to the local Casey's with my Vicar and we both purchased ourselves a shot at the big payout. (This, in spite of God's clear Word on the subject: (1 Tim. 3:3).



But before you judge us (Matt. 7:1), consider that we both spent (!) some time judging ourselves after our purchase. The questions we pondered ranged from, "What might I do with the money if

I win?" to "Why did I buy this in the first place?" We talked about how "If we just have the right attitude, God could let us win.' But in reality, and even before the drawing numbers were called, I knew what a curse it would be to win.

Oh, sure – I know that having that amount of money could do all sorts of good. I know that as a responsible, God-fearing person, I could even do some good – lots of good – for others and still have plenty left over for me without looking selfish. But all that stuff aside, I knew that I should've never bought a ticket in the first place. If, despite the astronomically small odds I'd win, I would thus have to consider the ramifications of such a win. I'd likely have to quit my ministry to manage the windfall. I'd likely have people in need (or more likely "want") hoping for a share of the winnings. How does one pick and choose who gets what? There'd be jealousy, strife, greed, and division all resulting from a silly random drawing. The bottom line is that even though the money could do some good, the question was if it would? None of these things glorify God. Rather, they detract from Him and His will. To discern God's will, we look to Scripture and see money as the topic of teaching all through God's Word. Our minds quickly race to the Widow and her mite (box!) (Luke 21), or the story of the rich young man (Matt. 19:16ff), and we might be tempted to think money is evil. But we can also see people of great wealth such as King Solomon (2 Chron. 9:22), or Zacchaeus (Luke 19), and understand that you can be both rich and faithful simultaneously. Money, then, is a responsibility. It is a burden and a blessing that demands our attention and must be managed (Eccl. 2).

As 21st Century Americans, we are continually worried about money. Not just Powerball drawings, but our 401K's, 403B thrift plans, investments, stocks, retirement savings, loans, school loans, bills and the like. Our lives revolve around if we think we have enough money or not. We even worry about giving it away. We vote at convention how we will spend our money and who is the most deserving of our generosity. Money, Money, Money! At every turn, there is opportunity for us to sin with respect to money. Thanks be to God in Christ Jesus, we find true wealth. Jesus paid for our sins that relate to money as well as all sins of all time. And He didn't need money to do it – instead, He shed His own precious blood to make payment and satisfaction to God for your sins.

18... you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, 19 but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot. (1 Peter 1.18–19 ESV) There at the Cross, Jesus made you a winner without even needing to buy a ticket. It was a free gift (Rom. 5:15-17; 6:23) ratified on Easter Sunday morning when Jesus rose from the dead. It's actually better than winning the lottery, because it will happen for you too, and it will last forever! Is it God's Will to make you rich? You bet it is! See John 6:40. But now that we're rich, we have to manage our riches. We can do good – lots of good – with the overabundance of our riches we have in Christ. So share it. Give it away freely! You couldn't possibly use it all up. Praise Christ! Amen.

"Days for Girls" Event Planned

Join your Christian (purple) sisters on Saturday, April 2 as Nebraska North and Nebraska South LWML Districts join together to host the first ever district-wide Servant Event. The place is Peace Lutheran Church, 1710 N. North Road, Grand Island, NE beginning at 9 a.m. CT. During the day Deb Burma will lead us in Bible study and we will be making/assembling reusable feminine hygiene product kits for schoolgirls in Africa. You do not need to know how to sew to serve! Some generous ladies have donated items but we still need:

- (1) 100% cotton in bright but dark colors for the bags and for the shields;
- (2) 100% cotton flannel in dark colors for the tri-fold pads;
- (3) Terry washcloths;
- (4) Girls brief panties (size 10-14) in dark colors
- (5) Ziploc freezer bags (gallon size) must be Ziploc brand only/freezer bags (NO Slider bags); The girls will soak and launder their pads in these bags with very little water; also will be able to transport soiled items.

The girls will use all the products that are donated at least 3 years – so high quality things that will last a long time is required. Donations to this event are optional and may be brought the day of the event. You may donate one or more items, if you desire. Sewing supplies/equipment (i.e. sewing machines, sergers, scissors, rotary cutters, mats, rulers, thread, etc.) labeled with your name would also be much appreciated for the event.

Mites in Action!

My sister Marie, a member of LWML Michigan District-Blue Water Zone, and I joined a tour group to the Holy Land this past fall. One night we met as a group to share a little about ourselves. Marie and I both shared how we are involved with LWML. As we went around the room, Gene Eng from Indian Land, South Carolina said he really had to thank Marie and me because of LWML. Since we had just met him, we were confused. Gene went on to say, "I became a German Lutheran at True Light Lutheran in New York's Chinatown." You see, his father was a Chinese laundry man in New York City. Gene shared how his father sent him to True Light Lutheran probably

to keep him off the streets or to use it as a kid sitting service. Gene said True Light Lutheran would not have been there if not for the help from LWML. God was at work at True Light because that is where he learned about Jesus, and for that Gene is ever thankful. Gene is glad to share with you also.

After returning home, Marie wanted to learn more about this, so she reread WHEREVER GOD SENDS US, Inspiring Stories of LWML Mites in America book and this is what was found. The first Chinese Lutheran mission in America was True Light Lutheran in New York City in 1935. By April 1, 1936 the work with the Chinese was officially underway by LCMS Atlantic District and Mary Banta, known as "Chinatown's angel of Mercy" was the one who held the work together, and was hired as a full time worker to assist Rev. Louis Buchheimer. The mission was founded in a loft. In the early years people came to learn English, boys turned it into a clubhouse on Fridays and the girls rolled bandages and played ping pong on Saturday,

but they also heard the Gospel. The loft was sold. They purchased a dilapidated building and remodeling began with the financial help of the Atlantic District and the LCMS Board of Missions. The building was \$65,000, but it would take over \$200,000 for remodeling. Their treasury was practically empty.

"LWML members also saw the vast mission field in Chinatown in those early years and realized there was much to be done. Therefore at the 1951 convention, the league granted \$75,0000 to True Light Chinese Lutheran Church to help liquidate its indebtedness." (Excerpt taken from the WHEREVER GOD SENDS US book.)

In 1967 the mission became the True Light Lutheran Church. Even though many of the Chinese have moved from the area, True Light is now a neighborhood church for Lutherans in downtown New York. "So, True Light Lutheran Church keeps the true light shining in Manhattan."




