From the Pastor's Study

Dear JPC family and friends,

According to AAA statistics, more than 115 million Americans traveled to a holiday destination in the last ten days of 2019. That's one out of every three people. Obviously, this year will be very different, as government officials urge people to avoid travel if possible – to stay close to home and avoid crowds.

Two thousand years ago, another government sent untold numbers of travelers out onto the road – not for a holiday, and not because of sickness. The Gospel of Luke tells us that the emperor, Caesar Augustus, issued a decree that a census must be taken of "the entire Roman world." Everyone had to go to their hometown to register. And so it was that Joseph went with Mary, who was in the late stages of pregnancy, from Nazareth to Bethlehem. That doesn't mean much to us, until we realize that's a distance of ninety miles! Over rugged terrain, in what was most likely unpleasant weather! Even if Mary rode a donkey, it would have been a grueling journey. "While they were there [in Bethlehem], the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no room in the inn." All the regular housing was full up. No vacancy – not even for a new mother.

Everything about that situation was unexpected. Uncomfortable. Inconvenient. A complete disruption of their usual lives. And yet ... God had his hand upon all of it. Joseph and Mary were right where they needed to be. Jesus was born at the right time ... the right place. For you; for me; for sin-sick souls in every century in every part of the whole weary world.

Are you weary, this year? If so, you are in good company. I don't know anyone who isn't tired, tired in one way or another. Nevertheless, rejoice! Take heart! Christ has come!

Despite all the disruption, inconvenience and even disappointments of the current year, Jesus, our Lord Emmanuel, is with us. He is not only with us, but FOR us – intending always what is best for us, and for this world that he loves. So may this Christmas season be a time of deepened hope, peace and joy as we celebrate the birth of "love in the flesh" – Christ Jesus our Lord.





Jamestown ECO Presbyterian Church HIGHLIGHTS for Session Meeting, November 18, 2020

The Deacons donated to the Jamestown Children Christmas fund and will cover any unpaid mailing costs for the Samaritan's Purse Shoeboxes. They also presented a prayer blanket to Barb Owens and they plan on providing meals to any member after surgery. The Deacons will also plan on coordinating two of the community meals besides the chili supper.

The treasurer's report shows the checking account balance as of October 31, 2020 to be \$14,284.10 with total deposits in October of \$7,326.47 and total expenses of \$6,428.16.

We are currently looking to nominate one elder & one deacon to complete the slate of officers for 2021.

Approval for Linda Pinney as the recording secretary for Session in exchange for one day a month comp time.

Because of the new state mandate, masks will need to be worn the entire time during worship. This information needs to be conveyed to the congregation before and during worship.

If there is a state ordered shutdown or if circumstances dictate, then session may determine the appropriateness of a shutdown, then we will discontinue in-person gathering.

As the Christmas season approaches, session will continually monitor the current situation in determining what arrangement would be appropriate for Christmas Eve service.

All activities for the youth and Friday Night Done Right were put on hold in November in response to the spread of COVID-19

On Christmas Eve, we will continue candlelight service featuring the bell choir, guest soloist, and instrumentalists.

On November 21 we prepared a take-out Thanksgiving dinner with 150 free meals sold out early.

On December 12, our free community dinner will feature lasagna, salad, bread & dessert

The adult Sunday school started Max Lucado's "Glory Days" book & video series led by Robin Ward and Pastor Sue.
