

# From the Pastor's Study

In last month's newsletter, I invited you to join me in a kind of summer preaching adventure, in which we will go "off the beaten path" and explore people, events or topics in the Bible that make YOU curious.

One of the requests I received, is that I preach about prayer. I probably won't do that during the summer, since prayer involves a number of aspects and is worthy of having its own multi-week sermon series. ONE of those aspects, is the frequently experienced fact that God does not always give us what we have prayed for. To give us everything we desire would please us in the short term – but what *pleases* us, is not necessarily the *best* for us. Consider these words found in the journal of an un-named Civil War soldier:

I asked for strength that I might achieve;

I was made weak that I might learn humbly to obey.

I asked for health that I might do greater things;

I was given infirmity that I might do better things.

I asked for riches that I might be happy;

I was given poverty that I might be wise.

I asked for power that I might have the praise of men;

I was given weakness that I might feel the need of God.

I asked for all things that I might enjoy life;

I was given life that I might enjoy all things.

I got nothing that I had asked for,

but everything that I had hoped for.

Almost despite myself my unspoken prayers were answered;

I am, among all men, most richly blessed.

Whatever you are facing in life right now, whatever petitions you lift to heaven for yourself, your loved ones, the church, the community, the world .... Pray, and keep praying! And may the Holy Spirit grant to you, and to me, the grace to sincerely say: "Thy will be done, O Lord, for you know best."





# Jamestown ECO Presbyterian Church Highlights for Session Meeting, June 23, 2021

**Deacons Report**: The Deacons will be organizing the July 17<sup>th</sup> community Saturday Supper; menu will include pulled pork sandwiches, potato salad, watermelon, and cookies. They will be asking the congregation to donate cookies.

The Deacons have decided not to hold a rummage sale this year, but will offer parking during the fair. It was also reported that two additional people have agreed to serve as deacons; Session will call a meeting of the congregation to elect them, on a date still to be determined.

#### Finance/Treasurer's Report:

The General Checking Account balance as of May 31, 2021 was \$ 15,328.45 Thus far, \$5,900 has been donated to the Parking Lot Fund.

Our 13-month CD is coming up for renewal in July. Several options for investing these funds have been explored. After discussion, session approved moving our current money market and the 13-month CD into a new money market account with check writing capability. This will earn a higher interest rate while still allowing access to the funds without a penalty, if that should be needed.

**Mission:** August has five Sundays; it was MSC to donate the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday offering in August to DART (Disaster Area Response Teams), an organization in Wilmington NC we have worked with in the past. The Mission Committee is planning a one-week mission trip to NC in September for a maximum of 10 adults, estimated cost per person \$100.00.

**Fellowship:** With the mask mandate being lifted in Pennsylvania at the end of June, session has decided to eliminate the requirement for wearing masks, however individuals should feel free to wear a mask if they prefer to do so. Session also approved opening the fellowship hall for inside dining during community dinners, and to resume fellowship time, with coffee, on Sunday mornings.

**Worship:** Save the Date! We are planning an outdoor worship service Pymatuning State Park at 10:30 AM on Aug 29, followed by a potluck lunch.

**Preschool:** Approximately 12 children have enrolled for the fall thus far. This is lower than prepandemic enrollment but we are continuing to receive registrations for the fall.


