Blessed is the one whose hope is in the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth, the sea and everything in them; the Lord, who remains faithful forever."

As our nation goes to the polls let not base our votes out of trust in a particular candidate or political party, and not from fear of the future. Rather, let us vote prayerfully, being guided by the Word and the Spirit of God. And as we look toward the future let us not be anxious about anything, but look with confidence to the Lord who is sovereign over all things, whose love endures forever and whose promises never fail.

HIGHLIGHTS for Session Meeting, October 28, 2020

It was a very busy month for the Deacons! They held their annual chili dinner as take-out only with donations going to Deacons. THANKS to Arnett Acres for donating the beef, Betty McCormick for the canned goods, Linda Volosin for providing and cutting vegetables & the congregation for all the desserts. There were approximately 128 take-out meals and 17 quarts of chili given out with \$622 donated to the Deacons. Prayer blankets were distributed to Andy Reese & Stan Mariacher; Money was donated for materials for a ramp for Mary Ellen Stambach (Robin Ward's mother) built by Tom Walker, Mike Henegan, Dave Leary, and Bob Hutchinson; and a gas card donated to Mariachers for Stan's recent surgery.

The Deacons will also help pay the costs to fill any remaining Samaritan Purse Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes – make sure you get yours and have it returned by Nov 22nd. During the months of November & December, all Deacons will be Deacons of the month!

Missions donated to the Christmas for Children of the community coordinated by Terri Livingston and delivered all the items people brought to the church to Root International in Mercer. Because November is five Sunday month, a special designated 3rd Sunday offering on November 15th for disaster relief will be given for the California wildfires. All donations for the November 15th offering will be sent for this terrible disaster still occurring.

Total donations for September were \$6,506 leaving us a checking account balance of \$13,385.79 on September 30, 2020.

Because we are not able to have in person activities, our youth made cards and "treats" for all of the residents at Lutheran Village and completed the study series God is Closer Than You Think. They have plans to visit the Cool Springs Corn Maze after church on Sunday, November 1st.

Our children's Sunday school has been taught by Mike & Carol Henegan, Suzanne College, and Jennifer Arnett in September and October; Alice Walker & Janeen Mihoci will be leading children's Sunday school starting in November. Adult Sunday school is completing the series God is Closer than you Think and will begin the Max Lucado series "Glory Days" on November 8 facilitated by Robin Ward along with Pastor Sue.

Upcoming free community take-out dinners include the Thanksgiving dinner on Nov 21 and on Dec 12, lasagna, salad & bread. Our continued thanks for all the food donations **every month** to keep making these dinners happen. The monetary donations that are given through these dinners have been a blessing to both the Jamestown Community Food Bank and the Healthy snack backpack program for Jamestown students.

Twenty-nine people were served communion on October 4, 2020.

Because for their dedication and diligence throughout the pandemic, all of the part-time employees of the church- Pastor Sue, Linda Pinney and Mike Costa will be given bonuses for the year (if you weren't aware, we have no full-time employees). Session also approved a 2% raise for all 3 church employees for 2021.

Session approved a renewal of Pastor Sue's transitional quarter time contract effective November 1, 2020 through October 31, 2021 at a total annual cost of \$14,476 which is a decrease from last year due to the National Gathering requiring no travel expenses.

We are pleased to have Rev Dobi from First Presbyterian in Greenville with us on Nov 15th and since Pastor Sue preached and led worship on all four Sundays in October, she will take 2 Sundays in December off with pulpit supply on Dec 6 by BJ Rudge (of Hermitage), and on Dec 27 by Rick Cepris.

Because Pastor Sue's will be on vacation December 3 through December 10, we will be celebrating the Lord's Supper on December 13 instead of December 6.

Upcoming special services include All Saints on Nov 1 to recognize those who have died in 2019-2020 and a Blue Christmas service planned for Saturday Dec 12 at 3:30 PM with music by Alissa the harpist.

A special thanks to our pianist and organist, Cindy Loveridge, for providing such wonderful music week after week.

Pastor Sue is attending a 2-session workshop titled "Anyone Can Make the Difference" (for faith-based orc ganizations) to learn about substance abuse assistance referral and resources available in Mercer County.

Weekly youth meetings and activities will be completely suspended during the month of November because of the recent surge in COVID -19 cases. Some activities may be planned for December depending on circumstances.

Cracks will be repaired, and the annex will be painted Monday through Saturday the week of Nov 16th. Due to its deteriorating condition, a recommendation was made to resurface the parking lot in the next 1-2 years at a cost of approximately \$40,000.

The ECO Rivers of Life Presbytery will hold its Fall Gathering featuring the topic "Spiritual Warfare: Breaking Spiritual Strongholds in the Local Church" on November 7, 2020 with Mike Henegan as the elected elder commissioner.

The Jamestown Presbyterian Nursery School Board would like to thank the mission committee, the congregation, the staff (Linda Lorigan, Amanda College, and Tenille McElhinney) and the parents for their incredible support and flexibility during these unsettling times. Lesson of the year: Be discerning, trust God.




Youth Group October Happenings


