BOOK REVIEW

Dark Agenda

by David Horowitz

The subtitle to this book is The War to Destroy Christian America.

I found that subtitle to be alarming. So, I had to read it. David Horowitz explains how the liberal left has been undermining Christianity. He states that the left has not used the legislature to process and discuss their ideas, but has gone directly to the U.S. Supreme Court to advance their ideas.

Case in point: 1960 Murray v. Curlett – Madalyn Murray claimed it was unconstitutional for the public schools to require her 14 year old son to participate in Bible readings, especially the daily recitation of the Lord's Prayer. This lawsuit was combined with Abington School District v. Schempp, a similar case in Pennsylvania. The Court voted eight to one in Madalyn Murray's favor. After 170 years in which prayers were said and the Bible was read daily in schools across America, the practice was ruled unconstitutional overnight. Her strategy was an anti-God crusade.

Next on the agenda was the Planned Parenthood's legal team that developed a "constitutional" argument they could take to the Supreme Court. They labeled it constitutional "right to privacy" Griswold v Connecticut. Defending the 1870 Connecticut contraceptive law and opposing the radicals, was the Catholic Church. These people were smart, they did not pursue a better law. But forced their ideals to be imposed on all of America.

In 1965, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled by majority of seven to two that the right to contraception was guaranteed by a "right to privacy" claiming that this right can be found in the shadows of other rights in the Constitution. There was no constitutional right, no mention of right to privacy in the constitution. This ruling in itself may not be alarming. However, it was the precursor to Roe v Wade. Remember, how the radicals wanted to impose their ideals on all of America? Well, it worked.

Acts of hostility toward people of Biblical Faith:

March 2009 – pro-life groups were shut out from attending a white House sponsored health care summit.

Sept. 16, 2009 EEOC Commissioner Chai Feldblum was appointed. He asserted that society should "not tolerate" any "private beliefs," including religious beliefs, if they may negatively affect homosexual "equality".

May 2009 – White House officials assemble a terrorism dictionary calling pro-life advocates violent and charging that they use racism in their "criminal" activity.

May 2009 – President Obama declines to host services for the National Day of Prayer (a day established by federal law).

Feb. 2012 – Student loan debts are forgiven in exchange for public service, but will not forgive the loan if the public service is related to religion.

Not so slowly, but very deliberately our religious rights are being eroded. This is a very great read, and will definitely make you think how our country is becoming anti-religious. I recommend the book, a real eye opener.


SOUND & VIDEO BOOTH VOLUNTEERS
