ere is another short lesson from James:

"My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials"

James 1:2

The key word in this verse is "joy". Let me be sure you understand the word joy. Joy does not mean that you walk around always smiling no matter what is going on around you. Joy is being assured that no matter what is going on in your life if you have Jesus as your Savior the end result will be eternity with God in Heaven. You see joy is often sad. Joy grieves when it experiences losses. Joy is angry when it sees the wrongs of this world. Joy might even be moved to tears when it faces trials, but joy knows the end result will be Heaven.

Joy is God-oriented rather than event-oriented because it centers on God and his presence in our lives and experiences. Now verse 2 says to count it pure joy when?

"...when you face trials..."

Let me make a point of how James puts this: It is <u>not if</u> you face trials, <u>it is when</u> you face trials.

We will all face trials in life as we live in a fallen world. The word used here for trials is not inward temptations but rather the normal things that life brings about. It is illness or loss of life. It could be losing a job or getting something stolen. Job faced many trials but none of these trials were temptations to sin. His reaction to these trials kept him from sin. When you and I face trials, the way we respond will tell us a great deal about our spiritual condition.

<u>So beloved, let me ask you this question</u>: **How are you responding to the trials of life?** Is God honored through you because you know in the end Heaven will be your final destination, or do you choose to respond in a sinful manner showing no faith in your trials?

Here is a final thought to consider for verse 2: "God does not allow us to face trials in order for <u>Him</u> to see how far along in our spiritual walk we are, but rather they are for <u>us</u> to see how far along in our spiritual walk we are."

How do you respond to the trials of life?
