give you the humble bicycle wheel. Honestly, I often take mine for granted. I mount my bike, take off for an epic ride and rarely consider that the quality of my ride will depend

upon this particular piece or rather these pieces of equipment performing as needed. The bicycle wheel is made up of many lesser pieces – spokes in particular. The spokes connect the hub to the wheel and because of each one working together, the wheel maintains its circular shape. If just one spoke fails, it requires a rider to stop and adjust the tension on other spokes just to be able to limp home at a much slower pace than normal. In addition, if the spoke deficient wheel encounters any significant impacts in its weakened state, it could damage the wheel requiring extensive repair or replacement.

Peter challenged us in 1 Peter 4:1 saying, "As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God." Every one of God's children has a gift that is needed for the church to work as God intended. If one or more of our members is out of place or not functioning as they should, the church can still move forward. But it, like the wheel, will wobble slowly along at risk of incurring damage that will require extensive time and energy to return it to its original shape.

What should we do? Let each one of us consider our place in the body and join our brothers and sisters pulling together with the gifts God provided so that we can enjoy this epic ride known as the ministry that God has called us to.
