#### WE ARE REOPENING FOR PUBLIC IN-PERSON WORSHIP ON JUNE 20, 2020

It is with excitement and some anxiety that I am pleased to say we will reopen for limited public worship next weekend beginning with the 5:00 pm. Worship Service on Saturday, June 20, 2020 (we will try to make this an outdoor service – weather permitting). There will be three options for Worship every week: Saturday at 5:00 pm., Sunday at 8:00 am., and Sunday at 10:00 am.

Early this coming week, we will send out further directions and instructions as your guide for coming to worship during this time of "Social Distancing" and concern for transmission of the COVID-19 virus. These will be posted in Facebook, our Website, and for those of you with limited electronic access we will mailout a copy vis the U.S. Postal Service.

God's greatest expression of love for us was and is the life and ministry, death and resurrection, of Jesus Christ. Our greatest expression of God's love is how we care for each other in the way he demonstrated. 'Love one another as I have loved you, and by this all will know you are my disciples' (John 13:34-35). It is with this, in heart and mind, that these guidelines are shared for how we can come back to public worship in a loving, caring and healthy way. We need each other to follow these so that all may remain safe, healthy, and cared for. Nothing we do in re-opening the church for public worship during this time is going to be perfect and many aspects, we hope, will not be permanent. We will have to revise the guidelines as we go to ensure the health and care of everyone.

Also, these are guidelines will help you make your own decisions about coming to church or remaining with the live stream option we will continue to provide. We publish these so that we all are on the same page and have mutual understanding of how we can keep each other safe and at the same time worship together.

# CDC RECOMMENDATIONS (PLEASE READ CARFEFULLY)

The CDC has identified the following population groups to be at higher risk of severe illness: those 65 and older, and those who live in nursing homes or long-term care facilities, and those of any age with moderate to severe asthma, chronic lung disease, diabetes, serious heart conditions, chronic kidney disease being treated with dialysis, a BMI of 40 or more, immunocompromised, and liver disease. The CDC recommends to protect yourself: stay at home when possible, wash your hands often, avoid close contact, clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces, cover your nose and mouth with a mask, and cover coughs and sneezes.

## BRIEFLY; GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR ALL WORSHIP SERVICES

- When you are at church we ask everyone to sanitize their hands. Sanitizers are available.
- When you are at church, all people of every age, must wear a mask. We want you to bring your own mask but we will have some available if you need one. The mask may become the new Easter hat...let's see all the various styles and patterns that you will bring.
- While at church we will maintain a 6 foot or more physical distancing unless you are within your immediate family group. Pews have been marked for ease of seating and sanitizing afterwards.
- There will not be Sunday school at this time.
- Restrooms will have limited availability.
