³Nathan replied to the king, "Whatever you have in mind, go ahead and do it, for the Lord is with you."

⁵"Go and tell my servant David, 'This is what the Lord says: Are you the one to build me a house to dwell in? ⁶I have not dwelt in a house from the day I brought the Israelites up out of Egypt to this day.
