Before communing, we follow our Lord's directions and examine ourselves as it says in I Corinthians 11. We ask ourselves: Am I baptized and do I believe in Jesus as my Savior? Do I admit I am a sinner in need of forgiveness? Am I ready and willing to repent of my sin, to turn away from it, and with God's help intentionally try to live in a way which pleases Him? Have I forgiven everyone who has sinned against me? Am I free of all grudges? Do I believe in His presence, that I am receiving Jesus' Body and Blood as He says? Do I believe His promise that if I confess my sins, He will forgive me completely? If you respond in a positive manner to these questions and feel led by the Holy Spirit to commune then receive the Holy Supper Jesus offers.

⁶"Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. ⁷But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you."

⁸Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid.
