2021-2022 SCHOOL CALENDAR

Next year's school calendar was finalized at the May Board of Education meeting. The calendar was attached to last week's Tiger Tales and will soon be posted to the website. The board voted unanimously to continue with the 1:30 dismissal on Wednesdays next year. Parents and teachers have shared that they have noticed some very positive effects from this practice this year. Our younger students return to school refreshed on Thursday and Friday and are not as tired at the end of the week as they generally were in the past. Many parents had expressed concerns about our long school days (8 hours) and really appreciate the break this provides their children. Parents and teachers are also appreciative of the additional opportunity to schedule appointments for their children (and themselves) and not have to miss school time to do so. Two of the three school districts that provide bussing for Trinity, Chilton and Brillion, have also opted to continue with early Wednesday dismissal next year, so bussing will be available for our Chilton and Brillion students.
