(1:3-9)

Church Council News

The church council met on April 10 and on May 8, 2019. As of April 30, 2019, the balance of the General Fund Checking account was \$822.62, and the General Fund Savings Account was \$13,895.37. The Building Fund Now Checking Account was \$26,355.12.

Interim Pastor Kristin reported on her pastoral activities. Since our last Council meeting, I have: Led eight Sunday Worship services; four Lenten Wednesday services, plus Easter Sunrise Service. Many thanks to the Henry's for hosting the location for the sunrise service! I led the Maundy Thursday Service and preached at the Good Friday service hosted by the Weimar Ministerial Alliance. I also led worship at Parkview Manor on March 24th. Have made several pastoral calls and visits to congregants and to the hospital. Brought Communion to shut-ins during Holy Week. The Pastor's Bible Study continues to meet on Tuesdays at 1:30pm as people are available. I have attended meetings of the Evening Circle and led the Bible study curriculum. Attended Worship Team meeting on March 18th where much planning occurred for Holy Week (Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Easter Sunrise and regular Easter service) as well as Holy Humor Sunday.

Also, was a speaker at a Women's Conference held at Ebenezer Baptist church in LaGrange, as requested by their pastor. I attended ElderFest on March 21st and April 18th. Held Interviews with Personnel on April 2nd. The Personnel committee made a job offer to Mindy Malatek and she accepted. Attended meetings of both PPR and Brotherhood on April 2nd. Made a presentation at "Jam & Bread," the clergy cluster for Heart of Texas Association on April 9th. Participated in the South Central Conference UCC Board meeting on April 13th. Mindy Malatek began work on April 22nd, starting on the website, updating mailing information, getting to know the services and tools available for communication and reminders with members, and so on. Led worship as Holy Humor Sunday on April 28th with good attendance. Attended the local festival luncheon on April 28th. Attended the April Chamber meeting and May 2nd Rotary meeting.

Also, I've been asked to give the Baccalaureate message for the Weimar ISD graduating class on May 22nd. We honored our high school graduates during worship on May 5th. Also, led worship with Communion at Parkview Manor on May 5th. Met with Council President to discuss preparation for Council meeting, how to schedule continued work on the Parsonage, discuss contract renewal, etc. I have asked that a window be installed in the pastor's office door for transparency purposes. Participated via Skype with the Heart of Texas Association meeting on May 4th; and also attended the Coastal Plains Area Assembly of the Disciples of Christ that same day. Called our delegates to remind them to make reservations for the SCC Annual Conference in New Orleans. Attended Brotherhood on May 7th. Reminded Worship chair of the need for pulpit supply 6/23 & 6/30 during my June vacation.

<u>Council President Ryan Brandt</u> let us know that the church profile has been completed by our Pastoral Search Committee and has been forwarded to our Conference Minister, Reverend Dr. Don Longbottom for approval.

<u>Under Old Business</u>, it was noted that the Weimar UCC Code of Conduct was approved as written. The church wide garage sale is being planned for June 7th and 8th. Donations will be collected until the week before the garage sale, so that we have time to price and organize items. Proceeds will benefit our church's wider mission and the Weimar UCC General Fund. Donated items that have not sold will go to the Red Cross or Second Chance in La Grange, TX.

<u>Under New Business</u>, Pastor Kristin's employment contract ends in July. A motion was made to renew her contract for 6 months and the motion was seconded and approved.

Committee Reports: Hugo reported that the stained-glass windows are finished and that soon we are going to begin the process of putting the framework and the windows back together.

Our Association spring meeting at St. Paul UCC in Corpus Christi was a joyful gathering. The first outcome to announce is that we voted to approve CJ Wood for ordination during her Ecclesiastical Council, after hearing from CJ about her story, her theology, and her approach to ministry as a full time chaplain in the Christus Spohn Hospital Network. Her ordination to that call by the Heart of Texas Association will be on Sunday, June 9th, at 4 pm at St. Paul UCC in Corpus Christi. We hope several of you will be able to come and celebrate with CJ.

At our meeting, we had attendance from 15 of our churches there, either in person or on the Zoom internet link. Of course, several folks welcomed us from St Paul and served an excellent lunch during the time when we shared news from our churches. Dana Worsham, pastor of St. Paul, gathered us with inspiring worship. Don Longbottom, South Central Conference Minister, was with us and spoke.

In addition, we voted to approve a \$1000 grant to Open Cathedral for their young adult ministries. We thanked outgoing Moderator Janet Sherman for the great work she has done and elected officers as follows:

Linda Coats (Friends Congregational), Moderator; Carl Schwartz-King (United Christian), Vice Moderator; Joe Ward (Faith New Braunfels), Treasurer; and, Arlene Turner (United Christian), Secretary.

For our Committee on Ministry, we voted to affirm the Committee's appointment of Tom VandeStadt to replace John Gage, and to elect Sid Hall (Trinity Church of Austin) and Maggie Gartner (Friends Congregational) to 3 year terms. We are grateful to our nominating committee for their work in finding committed nominees. We are also grateful to Charles Stark and St. John's, Burton, for hosting a gathering to attend by Zoom representing four churches; to Reuel Nash for putting in substantial time to get the Zoom setup to work well for us, to Joe Ward for helping with the audio, and to Jeremy Albers for setting up our Zoom meeting on the SCC Zoom account.

Joshua Lawrence, UCC Hurricane Harvey Disaster Co-Coordinator also, came and shared about the hands on work as followers of Christ that volunteer teams from UCC churches from several states are doing to restore rental housing in Port Arthur and about future work in Beaumont. 
disaster hurricane harvey recovery port arthur. He encouraged us to come, stay for free in volunteer housing,



UPDATE on CHURCH'S FINANCIAL SITUATION

For the first four months of this year (as of the end of April), our average monthly offerings were \$9,704.00. However, our average monthly expenses were \$12,454.00, thus requiring the church to transfer funds from savings to cover payroll and operating expenses. Fortunately, our church has the benefit, due to the generosity of our members, of having funds set aside for emergencies. However, these funds are limited and will be depleted in about six to eight months if offerings do not increase.

Once these funds are gone, the church will have to begin using Building Fund assets to cover any short fall in offerings. Once again, we are fortunate to have substantial assets available in our Building Fund, but these funds were set aside originally through Memorial Donations to help cover major repairs such as the repair of the stained glass window in the fellowship hall and leveling of the parsonage.

Whatever you can do to help our church overcome this offering shortfall would be appreciated.
