Who Will Go?

Every Friday for several months, an outreach team from First Southern has been going to the Villa Fairmont Mental Health Center, just a few blocks from our church. After passing through several locked doors, we arrive at the social room. Leah who has been attending our church greets us with a big smile as we enter the room. She excitedly tells us that she has found a room in Oakland. She is moving out from this place. We have been praying for her and her prayer has been answered.

As we arrange chairs for the meeting, an announcement goes over the speaker system that the Baptist Church is having a Bible study. Braz tells us that she has been reading from the Psalms. She thanks Shirley for handing over her own personal Bible to her the week before. Several residents ask us to provide Bibles and we promise to bring some next time.

We usually read a few verses from the Bible, then talk about what the words mean to us. Participants are eager to share their stories about why they came to this place and how desperately they seek God's help to get well. We ask the Holy Spirit to guide us to be sensitive to the needs of this group. The residents need our listening ear more than anything else. Sometimes I am unsure about how to respond to their comments. But one thing I know is that they want us to pray for them.

The only qualification to join our mission team is a willingness to listen and to pray. It would be so wonderful to see more people from our church join this ministry group. The residents in this institution need friends who demonstrate the compassion of our Lord Jesus. Here are men and women who are at a low point in their lives. I could be a resident at the Villa Fairmont, but by God's grace I am not. In the Old Testament, God asks Isaiah "whom shall I send?" Isaiah answers, "Here am I, send me." I pray that many will say "Here I am, Lord. Send me".

The Gospel as a Boiled Egg

One of the great missionary verses in Scripture is found in 1 Corinthians 9:22. The Apostle Paul says, "I have become all things to all men so that by all possible means I might save some". But what do these great-sounding words mean? Do they mean that I should become a criminal in order to witness to criminals? Do they mean that you should become a Muslim to witness to Muslims? How can we understand these words of Paul?

I found an answer by considering the greatest missionary of all time. This brave missionary left His home in glory, humbled Himself on earth, and for 33 years walked among us. Of course I'm talking about Jesus Christ. Perhaps we can best understand this missionary journey of Jesus by referring to two Greek words. One word is "hypostasis" and the other word is "morpha".

"Hypostasis" means *substance* or *essence*. In Hebrews 1:3, we learn that Jesus has the same *hypostasis* as His Father. Orthodox Christians have always held that God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit are all of the same divine substance.

So what happened when God the Son became a missionary to earth? That's where the other word comes in. "Morpha" means *form*. In Philippians 2:6 & 7, we learn that Jesus was in the form of God, but that he voluntarily took on human form. At the incarnation, the divine *hypostasis* remained the same, but the *morpha* changed to appear like me and you.

So what does all this have to do with missionary work? I believe that the essence (or *hypostasis*) of our missionary message must remain fixed. Throughout time and throughout space, the Gospel remains unchangeably the good news of Jesus Christ. It is the form (or *morpha*) of the Gospel that "becomes all things to all people".

Take a chicken egg for example. The essence of the egg does not change, but the form in which it is served can change dramatically. To Baptists I can serve boiled eggs; to youth groups, scrambled eggs; to senior groups, eggs sunny side up; and to Roman Catholics, eggs Benedict. To become effective missionaries we must know the particular tastes of our particular audience. The essence (*hypostasis*) of our Gospel message must never change, but the form in which it is presented (*morpha*) must change to match the tastes of the listener. "I have become all things to all men so that by all possible means I might save some". Amen, and pass the eggs.


