United Methodist Women

UMW Report for 2008

The United Methodist Women have twenty-four members. The unit meets on the fourth Monday of each month except July and December. The members read Response and New World Outlook as well as books from the reading program. Reports from these magazines are made at each meeting. The prayer calendar is used monthly to send cards to the missionaries and to celebrate a mission during the month.

The United Methodist Women serve a meal if the family so desires during the death of a loved one. During 2008 we have served three meals for families. The members along with the help from the church fellowship collect food items for the Holly Haven Home in LaCrosse, Virginia. The residents there are mentally challenged and are ones that have no other place to go. Holly Haven receives very little help from social services and sometimes they just struggle to keep the home open. The UMW members have donated stocking caps and gloves to the residents and plan to furnish pillows for them before Christmas this year.

Bake sales after worship service, a cookie sale during the month of December and a spaghetti supper are fundraisers for the unit. The profit from these sales are used to make donations to Central Rescue Squad, Ebony Volunteer Fire Department, Red Bird Mission, Henry Fork Center, VUMAC, the American Cancer Society and our monthly collection goes to Social Services for them to purchase gifts for Christmas for the seniors. We have met our pledge to missions, had a prayer and self denial program with donations made, held a candle burning program with donations in honor or in memory of a special person, gave two special mission recognition pins, donated to gift to mission, gift in memory, and world thank offering. We also sent four layettes to

kits for conference. We also purchase at least eight books to add to our library each year along with the prayer calendar. This year we also made a donation to a community emergency need.

Our members attend the Lenten Retreat and Advent Training events at VUMAC, Blackstone. One of our members has served on the district mission team for six years. This is her last year as social action coordinator.

The unit members stay busy helping whenever asked, share lots of fellowship time and visit the sick and shut-ins.

Our goals for 2009 are to continue to share the good news and help others when needed. We also would like to increase our membership.
