"Preserving our past while building our future"

Building Committee:

The future is looking bright for Prospect as we look forward. The Building Committee is working in conjunction with the Fundraising Committee to move forward with the Capital Campaign to enable us to build our new Fellowship Hall and Education Wing.

Our plan is a three phase plan: Phase I is to build a new Fellowship Hall and Education Wing to include three classroom/study/ meeting rooms, a children's nursery, men & women's handicap restrooms, a large storage area, large working kitchen with pantry and a choir room, all this will surround the fellowship hall and includes a new "bell-entrance" foyer. Phase II is to reside and reroof the existing Sanctuary to match with the new building, andPhase III will be to reconfigure the Sanctuary to accommodate additional seating for a growing congregation.

We have much work ahead of us as we begin to research possibilities from financial institutions and perhaps the need to "fine tune" our plans to align with our financial parameters. In the near future you'll see work begin as plans go forward to drill a new well in the front yard and extend the septic system to an area, past the cemetery, behind the building. We're looking forward to this work beginning, as I'm sure you are, however, there is still much work to be done through our Fundraising

Our work is cut out as we look to the future of Prospect and what it means to each of us and our Christian responsibility.



United Methodist Women Charge Conference 2010:

The United Methodist Women are twenty strong and we work hard to fulfill our mission. We meet monthly except for July and December.

Prospect's UMW ladies have adopted Holly Haven, a home in LaCrosse for the mentally challenged persons who cannot find help at other places. There are between fourteen and sixteen residents there all the time. Rebecca Jones is the administrator and so dedicated to her work and the residents. Every first Sunday in the month we ask our church congregation to bring food, paper products etc. to help with the needs of the home. Our

UMW and church congregation respond so willingly and it is so much fun to take the items there because the residents get to know your car and come running out to help take in the supplies.

During the past year the unit met our unit pledge and made donations to the five channels of giving. We also made donations to candle burning and prayer and self-denial. Other donations given were to John 3:16 Center, Henry Fork Center, Brunswick County Social Services, Relay for Life, Haiti through UMCORE, Jackson Feild Home, VUMAC, Red Bird Mission, Central Rescue Squad and Ebony Volunteer Fire Department.

This year our unit will present two gifts to mission pins. Prospect's unit is a Silver Mission Today unit and a six star unit.

The unit members participate in the reading program and we buy books to read throughout the year. We send cards to those in our church and in the community that are sick, need encouragement and for sympathy.

Some members attend meetings of the district and participate in district projects.

Our UMW sent kits to conference including money for some kits and also money for the shipping.

Our unit members made heart shaped pillows for oncology patients at Community Memorial Healthcenter, Halifax Regional Healthcenter and Southern Virginia Regional Hospital. We also served families of our congregation that lost loved ones this year.

Our UMW members have had a great time having bake sales and dinners to raise funds to accomplish our mission projects.
