Reflections from our Pastor:

I sit today to write this article for the Prospector, after shoveling the walks and preparing to make it safe for us to come to church Sunday. This has got to be the wildest winter Jan and I have ever experienced in Virginia. I saw a snowman on Facebook that had several knives in its stomach and the headline read, "Die Winter!" Although winter seems to have a pretty good hold, right now.

I'm sure most of you have read the headlines or watched the news today as the Marriage Ban has been deemed Unconstitutional in Virginia. Our Attorney General called it a "Great Day for Virginia." Our Sermons last week and this week are about our need to follow God's Laws. Jesus told us that he did not come to abolish the law. but to fulfill it. The law of our land and God's Law seem to be at different ends of the spectrum. This issue is one that will require much prayer and discernment. Our Sunday School program has given us many opportunities to ponder issues, scriptures, and to develop deeper friendships through God's Word and our own experiences. We are now studying The Wesleyan Way. John Wesley teaches us that Salvation is not an action or just a response to this relationship between us and God, through Jesus. It is an ongoing process in which we live and grow and think and discern our relationship with God.

We had our Young Adult Ministries first meeting and explored the book and DVD for 5 Love Languages. How appropriate for Valentine's Day! Each participant answered questions on a survey to discover their own "Love Language." We are going to meet again the 16th for another event and an opportunity to get to know one another better.

Our Bible Studies on Wednesday nights have been very successful. I encourage you to get involved in the one at church that Elaine Chipley leads, or the one at Charlie French's house that he leads. We continue to explore God's Word and would look forward to your participation and input.

I encourage you to be an evangelist for our church family. Tell them about all the things

that are going on and how Jesus continues to lead us and how the workings of The Holy Spirit inspire us.

JOHN WESLEY

The American Bicentennial of the Methodist Church was 1784-1984. John Wesley said "THE WORLD IS MY PARISH". Look at us now! How many United Methodist Churches do we have in the USA and the World?

CHARLES WESLEY

Charles Wesley wrote at least 6,000 Hymns. Many of them are in our United Methodist Hymnal.

FRANCIS ASBURY

Francis Asbury was born Aug.20, 1745 in England and died Mar. 31, 1816. John Wesley appointed him at age 22 as a traveling Preacher. He volunteered to travel to America. He traveled by horse back or wagon. Any where he could get a group together, he would preach the Gospel up and down the east coast.

When the war for Independence broke out he was the only Methodist Minister to remain in America. Francis Asbury was Bishop of the Methodist Church from Aug.7, 1771 to Dec. 7, 1815.
