


Ash Wednesday

February 10 begins our time of Lent with Ash Wednesday. A service will begin at 7:00 p.m.



Palm Sunday is on March 20. We celebrate the entry of Jesus into the City with singing and waving of the palm branches. As a special gift to his members and friends Rev. Ken makes crosses from the crown palm branches.



Maundy Thursday is March 24. This night is celebrated with a service and Holy Communion at 7 pm remembering the Last Supper.

Good Friday service will be 7:00 p.m. This

is the day the crucifixion of Jesus Christ is observed.



Easter morning the sunrise service will begin at 6:30 a.m. at the home of Chip and Bev Hill at Lakeview Subdivision off Siouan Road. Directions will be available. The Worship service begins at 9:15 a.m. Special music will be presented and an Easter Egg Hunt after the service.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN NEWS!!!!

There is much excitement in our Church as we begin another year. We began our Capital Campaign in 2010, and here it is 2016! We are excited to announce that the latest figure at the end of December 2015 is \$589,708.39. This is a \$32,000 increase since the closing figures for 2014! We are definitely CLOSING THE GAP, and we know WE CAN DO IT! We need to remain prayerful about this process as we work together to reach our goal of \$700,000, including three phases of our building process.

At this point we thank GOD that we have accomplished two of the three phases. We were able to do this thanks to the hard work and dedication of many of our members and to the loyal financial support of our Church family and friends.

PHASES I AND II

Our new education and fellowship hall has been built, and is being well enjoyed by both our members and our community.

The roof and siding of the Sanctuary have been: reinsulated, repaired and replaced to blend with our new bell town entrance and fellowship hall.

The steeple has been straightened

AND the bank loan has been repaid!!!

PHASE III is to look into ways to reconfigure the Sanctuary to accommodate an increase in our Church family and also have additional funds available for future needs of our Church. Our campaign is ultimately about expanding and enhancing our ability as a Church body to better support God's work now and in His plan for our future. We thank GOD for giving us this opportunity.
