Dear all,

I have had a lot of questions lately about how one becomes a member of the church.

The Episcopal Church 101 Forum, that just ended, addressed some of the basic teachings of the church; 1) the Bible, 2) Governance, Authority and Via media, 3) the Creeds, 4) The Book of Common Prayer, 5) Sacraments, and 6) Liturgy and worship. It barely skimmed the surface of the richness of our church, traditions and customs. We use this course for people interested in learning about the church and also as a preparation for **Confirmation**, which is "a mature and public affirmation of faith and commitment to the responsibilities of Baptism." The sacrament of Baptism welcomes a person into the household of God. Confirmation is a step that someone takes when they want to be part of a particular church.

Churches used to send formal 'Letters of Transfer' when a person left one church and began attending another. Membership today is more fluid. I have only received two Letters of Transfers in the last 10 years. Our diocesan church canons have a few things to say about membership:

Member: all persons who have received the Sacrament of Holy Baptism with water in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, whether in this Church or another Christian Church, and whose Baptism has been duly recorded in this Church.

Member in Good Standing: a term in common use but not used in either the Diocesan or National Canons. See Communicant in Good Standing.

Communicant: a member of this Church who has received Holy Communion in this Church at least three times during the preceding year.

Communicant in Good Standing: A Communicant of this Church, who for the previous year, has been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and has been faithful in working, praying and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God.

The bishop will come to Church of Our Saviour (date to be determined) to confirm those who have completed the Confirmation training. When she comes we will also offer a service of Reaffirmation and Reception.

Reaffirmation means that you choose to re-state your commitment to Christ in The Episcopal Church, honoring your growth in faith throughout your spiritual journey. For many people, their path has

wandered in and out of various denominations. Reaffirmation is a way to honor their journey and their previous public commitment as an adult while also making this definitive sacramental gesture.

Reception is common for people who have been active throughout their lives in other denominations.

Please let me know if you would like to learn more, or would like to publicly Reaffirm your faith or be Received into our church when the bishop visits.

Fixes and Flourishes Committee

~ Changing Priorities and Unexpected Costs

Welcome to the world of the Fixes and Flourishes Committee. We are constantly recording the needs in and around our buildings at Our Saviour, weighing and balancing those needs and adjusting priorities where necessary. Yesterday's #1 priority can be accomplished and moved to our ever growing completed list or can become today's #3 or #4.

At our June meeting we moved two items up the list and one down. Safety issues are paramount and preservation is a high priority. The front stairs were especially slippery in the recent and unexpected spring rains. We are researching a way to make the existing stairs safer. We also will be working on the needed rust removal and painting that needs to be done. The sprinkler system is showing signs of age and years temporary fixes. We are in the process of evaluating the needs and will be doing what has to be done to save our plants without overwatering.

The replacement of blinds in Peirce Hall was moved down our priority list. There are torn and damaged blinds but all offer some protection for now. The three needed for the library are ready for installation as soon as we get on the schedule! This will complete the library project for now.

Negotiations continue for the kitchen roof and deck project. After weeks of back and forth we suddenly were told we had to arrange removal of the HVAC unit from the roof, no easy task. After an initial bid of almost \$5,000, we found someone who will do the work for \$2,000. This not only adds to the cost of this project but also adds to complexity as three different contractors will need to carefully coordinate their work to get everything done in the correct order.

I have a pregnant partner and 3 young children to feed, and I'm out of money for food (and gas) till the 1st.


Like many others, I am on a fixed income from the VA and disability benefits at the moment, and the cost of food and gas and living in general has crippled me and my family.


I start a new job next month, that will hopefully get us into a better position, but in the meantime, I'm afraid of how I will make it to the end of the month.
