ADOM REPORT TO THE SCASB EXECUTIVE BOARD - JANUARY 25, 2021

As we move together into 2021, I am particularly excited that our first pastors' cluster group will be meeting this Thursday, January 28 (10:00 a.m. at Andover Baptist). Cluster groups have become important parts of ministry life elsewhere in our state convention, including places as diverse as Metro Wichita and remote Western Nebraska. The purpose of groups such as these is to provide authentic community and fellowship for pastors. Pastors are often surrounded by people for whom they love and care; yet, pastors may often feel very isolated – with hardly a soul with whom they can safely share dreams, burdens, challenges, and accountability before the Lord.

Our Strengthening Team Leader, David Gibbs has a deep conviction that it is vital for pastors to forge fellowship and accountability with one another that is genuine and helpful. I absolutely agree with this, and I am so grateful for David's leadership in initiating our own such groups. It is our prayer that that these cluster groups will be a valuable benefit, even a lifeline, to our pastors; one that will be well worth the time invested for both the pastor and his church. Please encourage your pastor to attend, but if he is unable, please know that we plan to begin other cluster groups in the future that will be more accessible to our bivocational pastors and others for whom this time does not work.

In November, 24 people from six different SCASB congregations travelled to Juárez, Mexico on a mission trip. Twelve of these were first time participants. Through the generous financial assistance of SCASB churches through our Sending and Sharing Teams, the financial burden for participation was greatly reduced. During their time in Mexico, the team built a home for the Patricia Poxtan Oliveros Family with the El Pasobased ministry, Casas por Cristo. The team also distributed 240 Mission Ball soccer balls and evangelistic packets in the neighborhood of the build site. This mission trip has become an annual offering among the churches of our association. While certainly worthwhile for anyone, it is a particularly good introductory mission trip for those who have never been on an international mission trip. Watch for more info on the 2021 trip.

As you well know, December saw the homegoing of our beloved brother, Charlie Keim, pastor of Trinity Baptist Church in Arkansas City. Certainly, we miss him and grieve his absence among us, but we can also joy in the knowledge that Charlie's faith is now sight. Please continue to pray for Charlie's wife, Glenda and their family. Pray also for Trinity Baptist as they walk through the valley of the shadow of death once again for their pastor, only a little over a year after Bro. Babe Standerfer's homegoing.

Initiated July 1, 2020, the sale of the former Maple Street Baptist Church property in Oxford was completed to Larry Book for a total of \$65,000. Apparently, Sumner County automatically reclassified the property when it changed hands, and we were sent a tax bill for \$8,451.46, for which we would be responsible for half and Mr. Book for half. We have filed an appeal for tax exemption which Sumner County has endorsed. We are now waiting to hear from the Kansas Board of Tax Appeals, but we have every reason to believe that we will be found exempt from these taxes.

The Administrative Team will be bringing a recommendation that we invest \$65,000 from the Maple Street Property Management line (9806) with the Kansas-Nebraska

Southern Baptist Foundation in a quasi-endowed fund. In this way we hope to leave the principal alone and utilize the earnings each year; however, the entire amount in the fund is available for our use on a few days' notice to the KNSBF.

Recently, we discovered that our Disaster Relief trailer has not been rightly covered by insurance. It was covered only by property liability insurance rather than auto liability as required. This has now been corrected, but in the process of reviewing our insurance, other questions came up regarding our coverage. Together with a few of our Administrative Team members, I will be meeting with the owner of our insurance brokerage for a full review of our coverages.

Finally, since I assumed the role of ADOM, I've been able to attend Sunday morning worship services in 2/3 of our churches, including preaching at FSBC Ark City, FBC Caldwell, FBC Towanda, and FBC Douglass. I was also blessed to be able to baptize my son, Micah on October 18 following his profession of faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. I look forward to visiting the remaining seven churches and missions soon!

 - a. Recommendation of a change of wording in the Operations Manual.
 - Pg. 8. Severance:

Upon completion of employment, employees will be paid through their last day of work, plus any unused vacation accrual and sick time. In addition, at the sole discretion of the Administrative Team, a salaried employee may be granted one week's pay for every year of service with the Association, up to a maximum of three weeks.

Pg. 8. Resignation and Termination of Non-Ministerial Staff

Employment is with mutual consent of the employee and SCASB. Therefore, both the employee and the Association have the right to terminate the employment relationship at any time, with or without cause or advance notice, by giving two (2) weeks' notice to the other party. At the discretion of the Administrative Team, failure of the employee to complete the two-week period, after notifying the SCASB of their intention to leave, will cause forfeiture of all accrued sick time. When notice is given by the SCASB to the employee, the Administrative Team

may, at its discretion, either have the employee complete the full two-week period or pay the employee for the part of the two-week period that the employee is not allowed to complete. This employment-at-will relationship will remain in effect throughout all employment with the SCASB.

ADOM REPORT TO THE SCASB EXECUTIVE BOARD - APRIL 19, 2021

As I have become more acclimated to the ministry of an ADOM, I have identified two areas of ministry in which I need specific training sooner rather than later: coaching and interim/intentional interim ministry. I will be beginning coaching training this Wednesday with John Shields, long-time pastor of Parkview Baptist in Lexington, NE and new Church Leader Health Director for KNCSB. Several Kansas ADOMs and ministers have received interim/intentional interim training from the Arkansas Baptist State Convention. These trainings were scheduled to be held in Arkansas this spring, but they are being rescheduled for the fall in an effort to provide greater safety from any COVID-19 threat. Nevertheless, I have been told that they will happily include me in their next trainings.

The pastor cluster group which began in January has now met three times, with seven of our pastors having been involved in that group. The group has had discussions centered upon strategic planning for the church, and we take substantial time to pray with and for one another as well. I am grateful for our Strengthening Team and its leader, David Gibbs for their investment into the health and well-being of these pastors. I am planning to begin another cluster group sometime this quarter which will probably be designed to meet the needs of some of our bi-vocational pastors. More information will be forthcoming.

I am working with SEKBA DOM Marty McCord to reboot the Regional Leadership Conference that we had to cancel last May due to COVID-19 issues. The conference will focus on "Revitalizing Your Church," and it will be held on Saturday, August 28, 2021 at FSBC Coffeyville, KS. Watch for more information that will be forthcoming on this exceptional opportunity to provide training for various areas of your church's leadership!

Following a visit to FBC Caldwell for worship at the end of March, Pastor Richard Awtrey showed me some areas of their education building that were in need of repairs in a maintenance. I connected him with Mark Jackson, and one of the mission teams that Mark has worked with out of Arkansas is planning to help FBC Caldwell this summer.

Some of you may have seen an article in the Cowley Courier Traveler regarding Hicks Chapel Church south of Dexter containing a note that they had "affiliated with the Southern Baptist Convention" but remain "a nondenominational group." I've learned that the church had arranged to meet last spring with Russell Cook, Blake Orr, and a representative from CrossPoint Church in Hutchinson. The meting was set for March 20, so it was canceled with the initiation of the COVID-19 shutdowns. Unfortunately, in the crush of activity of that time, the meeting must have been forgotten. To this point, the church has not formally affiliated with SCASB or KNCSB. I have sent an email to the folks at Hicks Chapel Church expressing my willingness to assist them in any way. If their doctrine and practice align with our, perhaps they might petition to become a member of SCASB.

Related to this point, both KNCSB and NAMB have recently noted that there are many churches that hold to doctrine, polity, and practice which is in alignment with Southern Baptists; yet they either have no affiliation or an historical affiliation that no longer serves the church well. ADOMs have been encouraged to reach out to such churches within our geographical footprint in the hopes that they might consider networking or even affiliating with us. I plan to begin compiling a list of churches which might be in this category. If you know of such a congregation, please send me its name and contact information!

I am deeply appreciative to those individuals and churches which have prayed for my family as we have sought to find a new church home as I've transitioned into the role as your ADOM. On Sunday, April 18, we expressed our desire to unite with First Baptist Church of Towanda. The church will be formally voting on our membership later in May.

During this past quarter, I was able to participate in a special appointment service at FBC Burden in which Bro. Chris Mackey was appointed as a church elder. It was a sweet time of celebration with that precious church, and I know that you will join me in sharing their excitement for their future ministry.

I've been able to attend Sunday morning worship services in most of our churches, excepting only Cambridge Baptist, the Winfield Lao Baptist Mission, and our Chuuk friends at NEMA Kansas Congregational Church in Arkansas City. I look forward to visiting the remaining congregations very soon!

Re: South Central Association of Southern Baptists Review for Period of January 01, 2020 through December 31, 2020

A review has been made of the Treasurer's Reports and the bank deposits for the fiscal calendar year of January 01, 2020 through December 31, 2020, and I have checked the reconciliation between them.

The bank statements were reconciled to the financial sheets of the Treasurer's Reports and no major discrepancies were found. The balances on the check stubs balanced with the bank statements.

I spot checked several months of the daily receipts to the bank statements and I also spot checked expenses with checks and found no discrepancies.

The Valley State Bank per the bank reconciliations increased during 2020. The beginning balance in January was \$81,845.06 and the ending balance in December was \$128,331.65 resulting in a net increase of \$46,486.59.

The large increase was predominantly due to a \$35,000. deposit on July 14, 2020, for the sale of the Maple Street Property in Oxford.

There was a couple of large expenses - \$10,500. to several churches

at \$500. each for church strengthening and \$5,440. for roof repair to Baptist Theological Seminary in Zambia.

The Union State Bank per the bank reconciliations increased during 2020. The beginning balance in January was \$120.86 and the ending balance in December was \$208.57 resulting in a net increase of \$87.71.

I compared the quarterly payroll reports that were filed with the Internal Revenue Service to the gross wages paid per check stubs and the amounts shown on the W-2's that were filed with the Social Security Administration.

All payroll taxes as shown on the reports were paid. Federal and State payroll deposits were made electronically as well as the annual W-2's and W-3 reports.

There is a consistent voucher system still being used for all checks written showing the purpose for each check. It appears that you have maintained good record-keeping procedures for audit-trail purposes.

I have not found any material differences in the review of the books for the South Central Association of Southern Baptists for the fiscal calendar year ending December 31, 2020.

ADOM REPORT TO THE SCASB EXECUTIVE BOARD - JULY 19, 2021

It has been a particular joy this past quarter to assist our Chuuk congregation, Nema Kansas Congregational Church, in overcoming some of the difficulties which had plagued them for several months. This wonderful Ark City congregation provides Gospel ministry to a people group in which few of the adults speak English. The church has two senior pastors and two junior pastors, one of whom speaks good English. Communication has been difficult due to this language barrier. I deeply appreciate First Southern Baptist Church of Arkansas City and Pastor K.C. Colvin for their longstanding work alongside this congregation. In particular, K.C. has invested numerous hours into our efforts to help the Chuuks. Also, I appreciate Lead Pastor Render Helson and Pastor Ezra Uremwech for being diligent to work with us in spite of language barriers.

We've discovered that the Chuuk church meets for worship at 1:30pm on Sundays with perhaps 55 adults and 25 children. Their services are conducted in Chuukese, but are vibrant with congregational singing, prayers, and proclamation from the Scriptures. As we investigated their troubles, we learned that their church had had no water or HVAC service since December. Probably, their water leak dated back to around October 2020 before the city shut them off due to the leak. We were able to secure bids from Air Tech Plumbing, Heating & AC to fix both problems. Their plumbing was fixed on May 26, and their new HVAC system was installed July 9. Significant financial assistance for these repairs was provided by South Haven Baptist, FBC Burden, FBC Belle Plaine, FSBC Ark City, and two individual donors. Their generosity helped to greatly reduce the amount that the Chuuks had to spend themselves from their limited financial reserves, and I can report that the leaders of the Chuuk church have been so very thankful for the assistance they received. Additionally, I helped the Chuuks to file a "Water leak adjustment" form with the Ark City Utilities office in hope that they will receive a reimbursement for some of the large water bills the leak caused.

As noted in April, the Chuuks had also been informed that taxes were due on their property. This was of particular concern because K.C. Colvin had worked to file for their tax exemption twice previously. We remain uncertain as to why his efforts did not get their exemption status changed, but we once again filed an appeal for tax exemption with the county on June 10. We now must await the ruling from the Kansas Board of Tax Appeals, but there should be no reason why they would not be found exempt from taxes.

Finally, in working with the Chuuks, it was discovered that they had never filed articles of incorporation with the State of Kansas, which could open them up to personal liability in the event they were to be sued for any reason. At their request, I am now prepared to file articles of incorporation on their behalf.

I hope that you will plan now to attend the Regional Leadership Conference "Revitalizing Your Church," that will be held on Saturday, August 28, 2021 at FSBC Coffeyville, KS. Please watch for more information that will be forthcoming very soon on this exceptional opportunity to provide training for various areas of your church's leadership! During this past quarter, I have been able to attend Sunday morning worship services at South Haven, FSBC Ark City, Nema Kansas Congregational Church (Chuuk), FBC Towanda, Andover Baptist, Trinity Ark City, and FBC Belle Plaine in addition to preaching at Prairie Hills Augusta, FBC Towanda, and Andover Baptist. The only church I have not yet attended is the Winfield Lao Baptist Mission, which I hope to attend soon! In August, I am currently scheduled to preach at FBC Towanda, FSBC Augusta, Andover Baptist, and FSBC El Dorado. I still have availability to preach in September and October, if your church is in need, or if you might want to highlight the critically important Viola Webb Missions Offering for State and Associational Missions.

Greetings beloved partner church of the South Central Association of Southern Baptists!

Please find enclosed the proposed 2022 SCASB operating budget to be presented for action at the Annual Meeting Monday, October 4, 2021 at Hillside Baptist Church in Wellington. The meeting will start at 6:30 pm. The proposed budget presents an overall increase of 3.23%.

Before we highlight a few items for clarity, let me address a developing concern. The last few years, our association has relied upon designated money from the Viola Webb state missions offering for the Starting Team funds and to supplement our DOM Salary. As we continue to utilize those funds in this year's budget, we will nearly exhaust those designated funds for our future, UNLESS each of our churches generously support the Viola Webb offering in a few weeks. Half of the funds given from our Association churches comes back to our Association for this designated account. Please encourage generous giving from your church so that we do not have deep concerns preparing for the 2023 budget.

Now for the budget at hand:

- *Cf. 100-106: DOM Compensation Plan.* The most significant change in this year's plan is the needed increase in the health insurance premium for Voyt's family. The 2021 budget process prematurely underestimated the premiums the family would incur as we took over the provision for the Lynns.
- *Cf. 110: Secretary Salary.* This year's package reflects a \$.50 raise to \$15.50 for our highly valuable secretary. Budgeting for 20.5 hours per week allows us to save beyond her 20 weekly hours for the extra time she will require to prepare us for our annual meeting.

- *Cf.204: DOM Ministry Reimbursement.* The 2021 budget was our first attempt to estimate the toll our budget would take as our new DOM would turn in mileage and receipts which our previous DOM declined reimbursement. That amount will prove insufficient for this year, so the 2022 budget seeks to be more representative of reality.
- *Cf.208: Annual Meeting.* The Administrative Team is seeking to make our 75th Association Anniversary Annual Meeting in Burden a special affair. We are asking for funds to make the event memorable as well as celebrative of our rich history, joyous cooperation, and expectant future.
- *Cf.403: Utilities.* Last February's Freezemageddon put the city of Winfield in an energy-cost crisis. The hit to our association will be spread out over a couple of years, so the utility line must be increased to account for this year's increased bills
- *Cf. 501: Sharing Team; 502: Strengthening Team; 503: Sending Team.* In view of the known budget total increase, the Administrative Team considered lowering the budgets for these three ministry teams. However, these lines represent our only expansion-minded, visionary seed money to be supportive of our churches' dreams and take some risks toward growing our ministries. These funds represent significant investment from all our churches into each church that will dream and labor to build the Kingdom of God in new and creative ways. Please dream with us!
- *DF 9800: Starting Team.* The budget for this remaining ministry team will continue to be funded with designated funds, and we propose that whatever funds are needed to bring this line to \$4,000 be transferred from *Designated Fund 9100: KNCSB-Viola Webb Offering*, subject to availability.

In closing, this budget reflects a desire to inspire and encourage each of our churches forward to more ministry and greater cooperation. Thank you to each church who has contributed! We have worked together and significantly blessed several of our churches this past year! As our budget continues to grow, the trends of blessing will only be able to continue to grow as each church seeks to grow our giving to our association and Viola Webb Missions Offering.

These numbers are a challenge for us all to give generously. A vote to approve does not mean we want everybody else to take care of it. A vote in favor is also a commitment to do more to grow our beautiful cooperation. May God be glorified!

ADOM ANNUAL REPORT - 10/04/2021

The past year has remained a time of societal upheaval due to the presence of the SARS-CoV-2 virus and COVID-19. Although SCASB churches have largely returned to normal operations, many have faced related challenges such as masks, vaccinations, and church members who have had vastly different thoughts and experiences with the pandemic. We mourn with our churches which have lost members to this disease, including the passing of Pastor Charlie Keim of Trinity Baptist in Arkansas City. Yet, we celebrate their homegoing to be with Christ, and we rest securely in the knowledge that they (and we) remain securely in the hands of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Throughout the year and a half that we've been dealing with this virus and its effects, the pastors in our association have been amazing! Each of these men has ministered through times of uncertainty, hurt, and exhaustion with grace, mercy, and love that can only be born from fellowship with Christ and a deep affection for the church which God has entrusted to him. I am so thankful for the sacrificial service of all our pastors!

Over the past year SCASB churches have worked together to do wonderful ministry. Please take time to read the reports from your ministry teams! Notable other cooperation occurred when several churches worked to provide missions funding for emergency situations. In November 2020, churches sent \$5,440 to the Baptist Theological Seminary of Zambia for repairs needed from a severe thunderstorm which blew the roof off the seminary and caused other destruction. In the spring, churches and individuals generously gave over \$9,000 toward needed repairs for Nema Kansas Congregational (Chuuk) Church when they lost their HVAC and water at the same time.

We were notified in April that Cambridge Baptist Church had voted to withdraw from the Southern Baptist Convention, though not due to anything negative at the associational level. We remain grateful for our brothers and sisters in Christ in Cambridge and pray that God will continue to bless their ministry.

A new SBC church has been planted in El Dorado! Please be sure to read the Starting Team's report about Connect Church (Jered Williams, pastor). Jered has recently passed an assessment with the North American Mission Board as a church planter, and we look forward to the possibility of welcoming them into fellowship with SCASB as a mission.

During the past quarter, I have been able to preach at FSBC Augusta, Andover Baptist, Living Stones Fellowship of Bolivar, MO (regarding Mexico Mission Trip), FSBC El Dorado, South Haven Baptist Church, and Central Baptist Winfield. I was also able to attend services at FBC Udall. If I am not already scheduled elsewhere, I would always welcome the opportunity to preach in your church or otherwise speak regarding the SCASB, KNCSB, or one of our annual missions offerings. I do have availability in October if you might want to highlight the critically important Viola Webb Missions Offering for State and Associational Missions.

Finally, as we move toward 2022, preparations are already being made in anticipation of our celebration of the 75th Anniversary of South Central Association! Blake Orr, a longtime pastor in the SCASB, will be heading up a team that will plan many elements of our Diamond Celebration. You will not want to miss this special time of celebration, remembrance, and looking to the future; so, plan now to attend the 2022 SCASB Annual Meeting, our 75th Anniversary Celebration!

The amount made available was not to exceed \$150 per occasion. Lastly, the Strengthening Team approved the use of \$1000 to help FSBC El Dorado offset expenses related to their planning and support of the city-wide revival in El Dorado held September 12-18. 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Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation

Adopted October 3, 2011

AMENDED AND RESTATED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION AND CONSTITUTION OF THE SOUTH CENTRAL ASSOCIATION OF SOUTHERN BAPTISTS

South Central Association of Southern Baptists (SCASB), originally incorporated as the South Central Baptist Association (SCBA) on December 28, 1959, hereby adopts these Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation and Constitution as approved by the South Central Association of Southern Baptists in its Annual Meeting, October 3, 2011 and duly adopted by the directors of the South Central Association of Southern Baptists in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 17-6605.

ARTICLE I – NAME AND ORIGINAL FILING

The name of the Association shall be South Central Association of Southern Baptists, having been changed from the name of original incorporation, South Central Baptist Association. Original articles of incorporation were filed with the secretary of state December 28, 1959.

ARTICLE II – REGISTERED AGENT

The address of the registered office of the SCASB is 1922 Central Street, Winfield, KS 67156, and the name of the registered agent at that address is Mary Jo Stuckey.

ARTICLE III – PURPOSE

The SCASB exists to resource its member congregations in ways that will enable them to fulfill their unique, God-given vision for reaching the lost, developing disciples and leaders, and being involved in missional partnerships.

To further such objects and purposes, the SCASB shall have and may exercise all the powers conferred by the laws of the State of Kansas upon corporations formed under the laws pursuant to and under which the SCASB is formed, as such laws are now in effect or may at any time hereby be amended. Specifically, the SCASB shall have power to acquire, purchase, hold, lease, convey, mortgage and pledge such real and personal property in the State of Kansas, and other states of the United States and elsewhere, as shall be necessary or convenient to the transaction of its business and the realization of its objects and purposes.

Provided, however, that in all events and under all circumstances, and notwithstanding merger, consolidation, reorganization, termination, dissolution, or winding up of this corporation, the following provisions shall apply:

- a. The SCASB is organized exclusively for religious, educational and charitable purposes, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or the corresponding provision of any future federal tax code).
- b. The SCASB shall not have or exercise any power or authority either expressly, by interpretation, or by operation of law, nor shall it directly or indirectly engage in any activity that would prevent the SCASB from qualifying (and continuing to qualify) as an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or the corresponding provision of any future federal tax code). Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the SCASB shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code,

or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

- c. The SCASB shall never be operated for the primary purpose of carrying on a trade or business for profit.
- d. No part of the net earnings of the SCASB shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the SCASB shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in these Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation and Constitution.
- e. No substantial part of the activities of the SCASB shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the SCASB shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements), any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE IV – MEETINGS

The SCASB shall meet annually. The Executive Board (as defined in the SCASB Operations Manual) is empowered to call special meetings of the SCASB as necessary. The senior pastor of each member church of the SCASB, or congregation sponsored by a member church, shall automatically be a Messenger (as defined in the SCASB Operations Manual). Additionally, each member church of the SCASB shall be entitled to three (3) Messengers approved by the church. Where the membership of a church exceeds fifty (50) members as reported in the Annual Church Profile, such a church shall be entitled to one (1) additional Messenger for each additional fifty (50) members, or fraction thereof, provided that no church shall be entitled to more than ten (10) Messengers. Further information regarding the meetings of the SCASB is detailed in the SCASB Operations Manual.

ARTICLE V – MEMBERSHIP

The SCASB shall not have authority to issue capital stock. The SCASB shall have voting members. The membership of the SCASB will consist of the present member congregations of the SCBA. The requirements and procedures for admitting additional congregations are detailed in the SCASB Operations Manual.

ARTICLE VI – AUTHORITY

The SCASB has no authority over any member congregation. It shall, nevertheless, be the duty of the SCASB to offer counsel to any member congregation in need of such assistance. However, the SCASB reserves the right, upon two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Messengers present and voting at any meeting, to refuse to seat the Messengers from and/or to withdraw the membership of any member congregation that has become unscriptural in its doctrine or practice. <u>The Baptist Faith and Message</u>, adopted by the Southern Baptist Convention in 2000, shall be the guide for interpretation of doctrine and practice.

ARTICLE VII - THE EXECUTIVE BOARD AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The SCASB shall have an Executive Board for the purpose of conducting the business of the SCASB between the Annual Meetings of the SCASB. The Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer of the SCASB shall hold the same offices on the Executive Board. The responsibilities and terms of office of each officer are detailed in the SCASB Operations Manual. The membership, meetings, and limitations of the Executive Board are detailed in the SCASB operations Manual. The Moderator, Vice-Moderator, and Clerk of the SCASB shall be considered the Board of Directors of the SCASB under Kansas law. Directors shall serve without compensation. The SCASB, in annual or special meeting, may restrict the powers and duties of the Board of Directors or the Executive Board, by amendment to the SCASB Operations Manual.

ARTICLE VIII – STAFF

The Associational Director of Missions/Church Planting Catalyst (ADOM/CPC) of the SCASB shall be accountable to the Executive Board. All other staff shall be under the supervision of the ADOM/CPC. Personnel matters are detailed in the SCASB Operations Manual. The ADOM/CPC selection process and job description are detailed in the SCASB Operations Manual.

ARTICLE IX – OPERATIONS MANUAL

The SCASB Operations Manual shall be considered the bylaws of the SCASB for purposes of Kansas law. The oversight and maintenance of the SCASB Operations Manual shall be the responsibility of the Administrative Team (as defined in the SCASB Operations Manual) or an ad-hoc team as assigned by the Administrative Team. The Operations Manual shall be approved and may be amended by the SCASB or the Executive Board. The Administrative Team membership, meetings, and limitations are detailed in the SCASB Operations Manual.

ARTICLE X-TEAMS

The Administrative Team may determine and establish any additional teams of the SCASB as needed. The purpose of a team shall be detailed in written form by the Administrative Team until documented in the SCASB Operations Manual. Purposes of teams shall be detailed in the SCASB Operations Manual.

ARTICLE XI – AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended at an Annual Meeting or special meeting of the SCASB after having been read and/or discussed at one previous Executive Board meeting and having been published and distributed to each congregation in the SCASB. A vote of the Messengers to amend this constitution is effective only if at least thirty (30) percent of member congregations have at least one Messenger in attendance at the vote. Amendments to this constitution shall be by two-thirds (2/3) vote of Messengers present and voting.

ARTICLE XII - RULES OF ORDER

The moderator shall conduct all meetings of the SCASB in an orderly manner as exemplified by the New Testament. The current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be persuasive as a parliamentary authority for all business meetings.

ARTICLE XIII - DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution, the assets are to be used to satisfy liabilities and the balance, if any, is to be distributed outright to a non-profit, religious organization of like kind with the SCASB; provided, however, than in no event shall any assets be distributed to any organization other than an organization described in I.R.C. \$501(c)(3). Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the SCASB is then located, exclusively for religious purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE XIV - LIMITATION OF LIABILITY AND INDEMNIFICATION

The SCASB may indemnify and hold harmless, to the fullest extent permitted under applicable law as it presently exists or may hereafter be amended, any person who was or is made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative, by reason of the fact that such person is or was a director or officer of the corporation or is or was serving at the request of the SCASB as a director, officer, employee, fiduciary, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise.

A director of the SCASB shall not be personally liable to the SCASB or its members for monetary damages for a breach of fiduciary duty as a director, except to the extent such exemption from liability or limitation thereof is not permitted under applicable law as it presently exists or may hereafter be amended.

Neither the amendment nor the repeal of this Article XIV shall eliminate or reduce the effect of this Article XIV in respect of any matter occurring, or any cause of action, suit or claim that, but for this Article XIV would accrue or arise prior to such amendment or repeal.

ARTICLE XV – TERM

The term for which this corporation is to exist is perpetual.

ARTICLE XVI – ADOPTION

These amended and restated articles of incorporation have been duly adopted by the directors of this corporation.

NOTE: This constitution was adopted by the South Central Baptist Association December 8, 1953. This constitution was revised in the Annual Meeting of 1959. Original articles of incorporation were filed with the Kansas secretary of state December 28, 1959. This constitution was further revised in the Annual Meetings of 1979; September 21, 1982; October 23, 1984; October 21, 1986; October 9, 1990; October 8, 1991; October 8, 1996. This document was adopted as the Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation and Constitution of the South Central Association of Southern Baptists in the Annual Meeting of October 3, 2011.
