GRANT HIGHLIGHTS:

Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Food Co-op—\$10,000.00

The Food and Clothing Co-op plays a key role in helping students feed and clothe their families during their seminary years. Nearly sixty per cent of the students are married and are second career with families. The Food Co-op provides 80%-90% of groceries and household needs for future church workers and their families at no cost to them. A grant would be used for purchasing only perishable food items each month which are then given directly to the seminary students and their families.

Minnesota South District Student Aid Scholarships—\$30,000.00

The Minnesota South District offers scholarships to LCMS students studying at one of the Concordia University System universities or seminaries to become professional church workers. The training and equipping of men and women for full-time professional ministry in the Church is imperative to carrying out Jesus' Great Commission to make disciples of all nations. The training that mission workers receive in the Concordia University System helps them devote themselves to serving the people of the world postgraduation. This grant would continue to provide aid to current and future mission workers confronted with rapidly rising tuition costs.

Baptismal Identity

What is your identity? This is a question I often ask my confirmation students and many of the members of the church I serve at, as well. I want to share with you just a few examples of the answer I receive; I am myself, I am a student, I am a parent, I am what my job is, I am an American, I am a democrat or a republican. There are so many other ways that people identify themselves beyond these answers.

The reason I ask this is because our response to that question says so much about what we value and what is most important in our lives. And so today I ask you the same question, what is your identity?

While there may be many different ways we can answer that question, our true identity is not found in what we do, or what relationships we have with people, or what our interests are. Our true identity is found in the water of Holy Baptism, where the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, call us by name to be the children of God, drowned with Christ and raised to newness of life in Him. St. Paul puts it this way in Romans 6:3-9:

Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his. For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin—because anyone who has died has been set free from sin. Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over him.

Here God makes it unspeakably clear what our identity is. We are sons and daughters of God our Heavenly Father, through the waters of Holy Baptism. This identity changes and impacts all other parts of our identity. We are not just a mother or grandmother, we are a child of God, who has been blessed to be a mother or grandmother. We are not just our hobbies, we are a child of God, who has been blessed with our hobbies, skills, and talents. We are not just our careers, we are a child of God, who has been blessed with the career we have.

It is vitally important that we hold onto our baptismal identity as the children of God, because we are living in a world that is going through an identity crisis right now. Our children and grandchildren are going through an identity crisis. People do not know who they are or why their life has meaning and purpose, and so they are finding their identity in their sexuality, or in their politics, or in their race, and they are being left empty, because those things cannot bring life or hope or meaning.

The church has the message of hope, meaning, and life to share with the world around us. God has called us to missions because that is part of our identity in Christ, and through that, others may hear and know the love of God, and find their identity in Him. God can bring hope life, and meaning to our world, to your families, and to you.

And so, I ask you one more time today, what is your identity?

Screen 4, will verify your information (you may want to print it).

Why use Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised (RONR)? Why follow parliamentary procedure? Where do bylaws fit in?

Bylaws establish the framework for your organization. They let you know who is in charge of what and when. RONR are used to define the parliamentary procedures you follow, letting you know how to run a meeting.

Following the rules can...

- make meetings meaningful;
- help you arrive at what the majority wishes to do but also allow that all points of view are considered;
- keep things orderly;
- give everybody a fair chance to be heard.

Meetings do not have to be stiff and formal. You only need as much formality as is necessary to protect everyone's rights and keep things in order.

Amazingly, two of the best things that following RONR can do for you...

- they can help you learn to listen;
- and to respect other points of view.

And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another (Hebrews 10:24-25a).
