MISSION GRANTS - 2022-2024 BIENNIUM

1. Financial Assistance for the Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Indiana, Food & Clothing Co-op to Purchase Food \$10,000

The Food Co-op spends approximately \$7,500 a month on items such as eggs, milk, cheese, ground beef, fresh fruits and vegetables, and other perishables as well as diapers, wipes and over-the-counter medications to 80%-85% of food needs to future pastors and deaconesses at no cost to them. 2. General Operating Support – Transitional Housing with Supportive Services to Abused Women and Their Children \$20,000

5. Timothy Scholarship - Mayer Lutheran High School

The goal of the Timothy Scholarship is to provide tuition assistance to non-Lutheran families so that they will pay less tuition than a Lutheran family. This project started eleven years ago with the help of a generous sponsor who eagerly agreed with the Mayer Lutheran enrollment strategy to encourage community members who were not Lutheran and, especially, un-churched, to send their children to the school.
