ONGOING MINISTRIES

Sunday School: This is our grade divided Bible Study on Sunday Mornings at 9:45 AM at the Mission (Youth Annex)

FUEL (Youth Discipleship): This our discipleship time that takes place through large groups studies as well as adult lead mentoring and discipleship in small groups. Fuel meets on Sunday evenings at 6PM in the main building.

**We are moving completely to mentor/disciple small groups this spring.

The Mission: This is our weekly large group Youth and Family worship time in the Youth Annex. This time is designed to be a large group setting to include praise and worship and a bold effort to reach the masses with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We are seeking adults to participate in this worship time. When you place a large number of students together to study the Bible an adult presence is necessary and it gives you an opportunity to build relationships. Right now The Mission starts at 6 PM with food, fellowship, and sometimes a game, followed by The Mission Worship at 6:30 PM lead by the house band.

Sunday Worship: We encourage our youth to attend both services on Sunday and set together as a group down at the front of the sanctuary. Services are 10:50 AM and 6 PM. Lead by example to our youth!

Chi-Alpha Coffee House: This is a monthly opportunity for students to come hang out at The Mission. At Chi-Alpha we provide a safe, positive, Christian atmosphere for our Youth and their friends to come and fellowship. We provide a lost cost snack bar with limited programing. There may be a specific program or it may be just kind of open with games and fellowship with the occasional movie. Chi-Alpha is open the 2nd Friday of each month from 7PM-11PM (except during football season hours change)

Areas of Need:

<u>Discipleship Small Group Leaders:</u> We are in need for adults to commit to disciple 2-4 students on Sunday's at 6 PM for one hour. We will provide you with training and material. This commitment is for April – November of 2012. Our goal is to offer biblical mentorship and discipleship with adults teaching our students how to live out their faith.

<u>The Mission Worship Team Members:</u> We need people who will commit to faith attend The Mission Worship each Wednesday night for crowd control and for encouragement to our youth. You may be asked to take a small group of youth to encourage each Wednesday night and check in on if they are gone.

<u>Chi-Alpha Coffeehouse Volunteers</u>: We need volunteers to help plan, work the snack bar, and be at the Coffeehouse to ensure student safety. This project is growing and the need for adult volunteers is as well.

Activity Sponsors: We are always in need of sponsors for our youth activities. New for this year we are going to a 1:7 ratio for all our activities; which means that we must have one adult for every seven student's presence. If we do not have adequate sponsors we will be forced to cancel events and activities.

Weekly Bread Providers: We started this in early 2011 and it fizzled out. But once again we are going to have a sign-up for weekly breakfast for Sunday School. Our numbers for Sunday School are up so we are going to need at least two people for each week to help ease the burden this year. Believe me consistent food makes a difference in attendance. And consistent attendance gets the Word of God into more minds and hearts. You will need to prepare for 25-30 students.

<u>Scholarship Endowments:</u> We have many students who do not have the money to attend camp and other activities that we have within out ministry. So there is always a need for us to provide scholarships to students for almost every activity. I believe no one should be turned away because of a lack of money. You can help by designating a gift to the church as Youth Scholarships.

<u>SALT:</u> Salt is the Student-Adult Leadership Team. This is the team of students and adults that will assist Kevin in the planning and organizing the overall Student Ministries.

Youth Spring Break Mission Trip: There is always a need for adult and parents to sponsor or cook for the Spring Break Mission Trip. This in March each year and is six days long. We go to various locations each year.

<u>Falls Creek 2012:</u> The following is our needs for Falls Creek 2012: Cooks, food sponsors, scholarships, and prep team members. Prep Team Members are those that will assist in getting supplies to camp the Sunday before we leave. There is an opening for morning Bible Study teachers Tuesday through Friday this does not require staying at camp. Sponsors are hand selected due to Falls Creek Regulations. <u>Super Summer 2012:</u> Super Summer is our Leadership camp for students that meet the criteria. We have a need for the following: Van Drivers, Team Leaders that must stay the week of camp, scholarship donations. TAN Bible Study Method

No matter what passage we are studying it is important that we look at the passage from all angles. For instance, we don't want to study a letter written to people thousands of years ago and assume it means what we think it means in our lives today. We need to see what it meant then, as well. The TAN Method helps us to look at the scripture from all angles



Then- What was the original context of the passage? Who wrote it? Who was it written to? What was the occasion for the writing? Is the timing or location of it important? Tips: Read the first chapter of the book to find out some of the context. Always ask the 5 W's (who, what, where, when, why). Read the entire book to answer these questions. Why? The Bible was not written to us, but it was written for us to learn from and to apply. We must first know what it meant from its original author to its original audience.



Always-What are some universal principles that can always be applied from this passage? Is there a timeless meaning to this passage that will not change from generation to generation? Tips: Think in terms of the big picture. Ask yourself what significance this passage has had on every person for all of time. What principles have stood regardless of changing cultures and times? Why? Just because God's Word is an ancient document does not mean that it is out of date. God is eternal and His truth spans from everlasting to everlasting. Even passages that deal with people groups that no longer exist can teach us things about God and about following Him.



Now-This is where we relate the passage to the current day and age. This is also where we get very specific about applying it our lives. Tips: Consider your current personal circumstances as well as the current situation in the world around you. What might God be trying to teach you from this passage? Is He calling you to repent of sin? How might He be challenging you to grow and learn? Why? God is personal. He doesn't waste anything. He desires for each of us to take what He has done for all of time and learn from it. He wants His Word to come alive in our lives and become the ultimate authority for how we live.


