Completing 150 Year Celebration of Music By Mary K. Walsh

August 2018 marked the 150th anniversary of forming the first choir at First United Methodist Church Nelsonville. The year-long celebration, planned by the Music Guild, a re-creation of the group formed decades ago, included the Y'all Come Choir comprised of current singers and choir members who "came home" to sing at the event.

The creation of the Katie McCoy and Mary Jane McKinley Music Scholars Fund used donations from church members and friends of the church to recognize local students and teachers who use their talents in music ministry. The Praise Singers, under the guidance of pianist Kim Resanovich, continued their strong, meaningful contribution to music each week. Guest organist LaMar Wyse and guest director and pianist Janice Paris added their talents. The Chancel Choir sang at Christmas and Holy Week and FUMC coordinated Buckeye Ministerial Association's Carol Sing on the Public Square during North Pole Nelsonville. The Ohio Senate sent a proclamation celebrating our achievements.



Donations can be items you find on clearance, have bought but never used, items that you meant to return and never got around to it, items in bulk that you find online at a great price. The options are endless. In the future months we plan to collect school supplies, back packs, lunch boxes, toiletries and personal hygiene products, games, books, stuffed animals, and cold weather gear. You can begin to bring those items in at any time as well. Donations can be dropped off on the table by the entrance to the Sanctuary.


