Haston Highlights Library Materials Selection

The Haston Library strives to offer the residents of North Brookfield and surrounding towns a wide selection of books, DVDs, audio books and children's and young adult items, to meet a variety of needs and interests. Displays on the main level and in the Children's Library will show you the most recent acquisitions that you may want to borrow, including fiction, science, DIY, cooking, foreign affairs, biography, art and music, health, technology, history, economics and politics.

The library's *Materials Selection Policy (https://northbrookfieldlibrary.org/gen-info/library-policies/materials-selection/)* provides broad guidance and encouragement to library staff to ensure that the collection represents a variety of viewpoints, and we try our best to follow it within a limited budget. Because we obviously cannot purchase all books that are published, or even all the titles we would like, we must make subjective decisions about purchases. As much as possible, we base those decisions on trusted review sources, title popularity, quality, availability within the CW MARS network, and strengths or gaps within our existing collection. But our best source of information about purchases for the library is YOU. We want our collection to reflect the interests of North Brookfield library users.

If there is a recently-released title that you think we should own, please let us know. If you notice that there is a gap in our collection, tell us about that. We would welcome suggestions of books that may fill that gap. For example, at the suggestion of a patron we recently added several more books about the war in Vietnam to bolster our collection in that area.

Please remember that even if we do not own a specific book, you can still borrow it through interlibrary loan. Most of the time, desired items are available from other CW MARS libraries. If not, we can then usually obtain them through the Commonwealth Catalog. You can make these requests online yourself, or we will be happy to request them for you.

Finally, book donations are always welcome. New donated items are almost always added to the collection and are particularly helpful for titles that are out of print. Other materials that are duplicates or in less-pristine condition may be kept for the book sale, which provides funds for new purchases. As a rule, donors are informed that books may be added to the book sale, in case they prefer not to donate under that condition.

DECEMBER BOOK GROUP SELECTION

The December selection for the Haston Library Book Group is *Hamnet* by Maggie O'Farrell. "Set in Stratford, England, in the late 16th century, *Hamnet* imagines the emotional, domestic, and artistic repercussions after the world's most famous (though never named) playwright and his wife lose their only son, 11-year-old Hamnet, to the bubonic plague in 1596. Four years later, the boy's father transposes his grief into his masterpiece — titled with a common variant of his son's name — in which the father dies and the son lives to avenge him. ...Although more than 400 years have unspooled since Hamnet Shakespeare's death, the sto-

The Tale of Bernard the Bat

Miss Bri discovered a friend on November 15 as she was getting the Children's room ready for opening. Sitting in the sun on the floor and taking a nap was a brown bat. After getting the library's "bat net" and gently moving it outside, we thought the story was over and the bat would continue on with its life. The next day, Miss Bri realized the bat was still there, looking very cold and barely moving. After contacting a Tufts wildlife clinic and a rehabilitation center, Miss Bri brought Bernard the Bat (as she has dubbed it) to a volunteer in Hubbardston who brought it to the Colrain Center for Conservation and Wildlife Rehabilitation the next day. Bats don't do well in colder weather, so it is wise to contact wildlife rehab centers if you need a bat removed or see a bat in distress outside, before you do anything else. We hope little Bernard is doing well and wish him the best!
