# Haston Highlights Kanopy: Streaming Soon!

Soon to be streaming: thoughtful entertainment with Kanopy. Thanks to a consortial agreement among many CW MARS libraries, the library will be able to provide access to Kanopy.

*What is Kanopy?* Kanopy is a video streaming service that provides instant access to thousands of critically acclaimed movies, documentaries and kids' favorites. Offering what the New York Times calls "a garden of cinematic delights," Kanopy showcases more than 30,000



films, including award-winning documentaries, rare and hard-to-find titles, film festival favorites, indie and classic gems, and world cinema with collections from A24, Kino Lorber, Music Box Films, Samuel Goldwyn, The Orchard, The Great Courses, PBS and thousands of independent filmmakers. Kanopy also offers Kanopy Kids and the Great Courses.

How can you access Kanopy? There are no commercials or fees for users - we have it covered! All you will need is a library card to get started. Once we get the system up and running, you'll be able to stream Kanopy on any of your favorite devices. Kanopy is accessible via mobile and tablet apps for iPhone and Android. You can also access Kanopy on your desktop, and smartTV apps like Roku, Apple TV and Fire Stick.

How does it work? Once you have selected a film, you will have between 48 and 72 hours to watch it, de-

### **NEWS FROM CW MARS**

CW MARS recently announced that over TWO million eBooks and Audiobooks were checked out in 2021. CW MARS continues to see increases in usage of electronic content, and 2021 reached a record-breaking two million digital book checkouts. For CW MARS, this milestone illustrates the continued growth and importance of library digital lending of ebooks and audiobooks, especially after a prolonged period of building closures due to the global pandemic. CW MARS, a consortium consisting of 155 libraries in Central and Western Massachusetts, is one of 121 public library systems worldwide that surpassed one million checkouts.

CW MARS member libraries have been providing readers 24/7 access to ebooks and audiobooks for several years through the award-winning Libby app, the library reading app created by OverDrive. Reader interest and usage has grown every year. Member libraries with the highest electronic circulation include Worcester Public Library, Shrewsbury Public Library, Jones Library in Amherst, and the Forbes Library in Northampton.


"It's exciting that our consortium is on its fourth year straight of hitting over 1 million checkouts during a calendar year, with 2021 being the highest record to date!" said Brittany McDougal, Director of the Oxford Free Public Library and President of the CW MARS Executive Committee. For February, the Haston Book Group will be reading the classic Go Tell It On the Mountain by James Baldwin.

"Go Tell It On The Mountain, first published in 1953, is Baldwin's first major work, a semi-autobiographical novel that has established itself as an American classic. With lyrical precision, psychological directness, resonating symbolic power, and a rage that is at once unrelenting and compassionate, Baldwin chronicles a fourteen-year-old boy's discovery of the terms of his identity as the stepson of the minister of a storefront Pentecostal church in Harlem one Saturday in March of 1935. Baldwin's rendering of his protagonist's spiritual, sexual, and moral struggle of self-invention opened new possibilities in the American language and in the way Americans understand themselves. 




