- Requested documentation must accompany application.

Emergency Distribution

To be considered an emergency distribution, all awarded assistance must be delivered by March 31st. Extensions can be made at the discretion of the board due to extended cold weather.

Trouble paying your utility bills?

Call the utility company, explain your situation and ask about a payment plan. It pays to be proactive. We have found they are willing to work with you; as it is beneficial for all involved.

Cold Relief Heatline 1 (800) 632-8175

Funded through the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) assists low-income individuals and families with the cost of heating their homes during the winter season. The program is managed by the Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) in conjunction with 22 regional nonprofit and local government organizations. Benefits vary depending on income levels.

Worcester Community Action Council (WCAC) Energy Program 508-754-1176

There are income eligibility guidelines. Program runs from November 1 through April.

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

WCAC's Fuel Assistance Program is designed to provide relief to those households that are most vulnerable to high home heating costs. Massachusetts' Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) targets assistance to households with the lowest incomes and highest average energy costs. The LIHEAP is intended to help defray the cost of heat during the winter months, November 1 – April 30 of each year.

WCAC applications for the 2021-22 season will be accepted beginning November 1st. Recertifications for past fuel assistance recipients have begun via U.S. mail.

FIRST TIME APPLICANTS

- All first time applications must complete a face-to-face interview between November 1st and April 30th
- New applications can be submitted at the Worcester Office located in the Denholm Building, 484 Main Street, Worcester on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.
- New applications also accepted by appointment at outreach sites in Southbridge, Webster, Spencer and West Warren.
- Eligibility is based on the number of individuals who live in a household, their combined income, housing status and fuel type.
