- 5. To reach out to our **Awana parents** and provide discipleship not only for their children, but for them
- 6. To be good stewards and have a balanced budget
- 7. To minister to young families and help them disciple their children
- 8. To **connect with members** who haven't attended and encourage them to reengage with the church
- 9. To have a vibrant men's ministry growing out of Baptist Men
- 10. To have an active, growing youth ministry
- 11. To reach out to **new families** in the community
- 12. To maintain the many excellent ministries currently underway at JHBC!

That is a tremendously exciting list! I'm not sure about all the details yet, but that's OK! Because we believe with all of our hearts that as we humble ourselves and cry out to God, **HE WILL BLESS** and multiply His church, for His glory! I believe 2020 is going to be a great year at JHBC!

ACCORDING TO RW...

"Look at the birds of the air; they neither show nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?

And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life?"

– Matthew 6:26-27 (The Message)

How many of you worry? I know I have found myself worrying about things, most of them out of my control. If worrying could add a single hour to my span of life, then I wouldn't have to think about leaving this earth anytime soon. The truth is, worry steals more than it gives. It creates more problems than it solves and it leaves us exhausted from a constant barrage of worrisome thoughts and almost leaves us paralyzed with numerous "what if's" that almost never actually happen.

When I lived in Durham, I was always fascinated to see deer that would be in our small back yard in a large subdivision in a city. I was used to seeing them in the back yard of the house I grew up in outside a small town in what seemed like the middle of nowhere. As I think about these deer, though, I see that every day they have to "worry" about getting food for themselves. They can't do anything to make food appear. They can't plant trees or grow corn. All they can do is get up and go look in the places where they have found food before, like in the woods behind my house.

They eat things that most of us would not find desirable, but perhaps those things that are undesirable to us are there to meet the needs of others, because that is what God does. God provides.

As we begin this new year, perhaps it would be a good time to remember that God provides and that we need to renew our faith and trust in God to provide for us. I don't know what that looks like for you. Perhaps it's a relationship that needs to be mended. Perhaps it's related to finances, or possibly some difficult decisions that need to be made.

"Do not worry!" God says. I've written about Sabbath before, and I write about it again to remind each of us that it is a time to turn our worries over to God. To experience true rest from worry. To remember that we are people of faith and that God can be trusted to provide for us. God cares so much for the smallest creatures that God hardwired into the universe a way for their needs to be met. How much more will he care for you and me?

For 2020, make it a point to "cast your cares upon God" because God cares for you. Worry cannot add a single moment to your life, but it can certainly take moments of joy away. Finding Sabbath rest in God is about experiencing the joy that God has for us.

Do not worry... practice Sabbath!

Worship Notes from Scott

Wow, the beginning of a new year. And not just any year, it's the beginning of my third year at JHBC, and it's 2020. I'll get into the uniqueness of that year later, but first a little reflection before I look forward.

Our Choir recently presented a special Christmas message called *The Story of Christmas*. I'd like to brag on them a little, and here's why. An interesting thought ran across my mind at some point in the middle of the 2nd presentation on Sunday afternoon, December 8. As I looked across the Choir's faces (still conducting, mind you), the thought came to me, "I think this is the best, most together this Choir has sung in the last two years. Their diction and attention to detail, not to mention their communication of the message was excellent. You've probably noticed that whenever the Choir sings, I have the words that they are singing up on the screen. That is not for their benefit, it's for the sake of the congregation. I want to make sure that the congregation knows the message the Choir is singing, and if they can't understand the words we are singing, at least they can read them from the screen. But what people have told me is that they didn't need the words on the screen, because they could understand them clearly from the Choir themselves. That's hitting one of the bullseyes that we aim for when we sing! I was so proud (in the best way) of them, and I hope you were too.

And that any of our youth and children probably aren't even aware of that term. Now, it's twenty years later, and we are living in the year 2020. A term that until now has more often been used to talk about the quality of our vision. We also have this saying that goes, "Hindsight is 2020.", which means it's easier to understand what was then a confusing event or situation now, after having gone through it and seeing how it all turned out. Hopefully that also gives us wisdom as we go forward.

For me, I see the beginning of 2020 as a great time to do some fresh things, use that 2020 hindsight to tweak the way we do things moving forward, and to look bravely and confidently to the future, knowing God has some amazing things in store for me, and for us. I am reminded of a wonderful verse.

Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." - Joshua 1:9



Dear Friends and Family,

We pray that you are all well and enjoying the holidays. Shpresa and I spent the past week in



Podgorica Montenegro. Together with the leadership team for TeenStreet Balkan we have begun praying, planning, and preparing for TeenStreet Balkan 2020! Please pray for us as we plan and continue to look for a new venue. If needed, we will continue at the place it has been held in the past, but we would really like a new venue. Right now, there is only one other real option and we are waiting to see if it will work out there.

While we were in Podgorica, a 6.4 magnitude earthquake hit Albania, only a few hours from us. We woke up at 4:00 am to the house shaking for over 20 seconds. We are thankful that we and those we know in Albania were not hurt, however, 51 people in total did die. Obviously, many people in Albania were in shock from this devastating event. Many people from the areas most affected have left for a time until things calm down, many people have even come here to Peja to stay for a while. A couple from Tirana came to the church yesterday in Peja. They shared that many people are afraid, but God has been strengthening the Albanian church. Even before the earthquake, many Christians felt the need to lift up their nation in prayer to God. Please pray for all those affected by this disaster and that God will continue to strengthen the church to help those in need, as well as opportunities to lead others to the Prince of Peace.

Lord willing in the next few days, we should be able to release a Christmas song written for children. It was written this past April when Heart Sounds were here. For the first time, we are recording a choir of children that come to the children/teens meeting at the church here in Peja. Most of these children are not yet believers, pray that this song especially will help them to understand the true meaning of Christmas. Pray for their friends and families as well that may hear the song, that God will open their eyes to the beauty of Christmas and the Gospel.

This next Sunday (December 8th), Shpresa and I will be helping a local church in Prishtina with their Christmas outreach. They are hosting a big event Sunday night at a hotel in downtown Prishtina. We will mainly be helping run sound and helping with the set-up. The event will consist of worship and other music, a show from an illusionist, and a Christmas message. The main audience will be non-believers as the event will be evangelistic. We are praying to have 200+ people there. Please pray for this church as they prepare and continue to invite people. Pray that God brings the right people that will be spiritually open to hear the message.

December 14th, Shpresa will be leading worship for another Christmas event for women in Prishtina. This is a yearly event that happens mainly for Christian women in Kosovo. The couple of months Shpresa has also been getting more involved with the youth meeting at church on Sunday. During these meetings, the focus is on Bible study. Most of the teens that come are not yet believers and do not know much about the Bible. She has been helping them with simple but deep Bible studies, focusing on just one or two verses at a time and really helping them to understand the message of the Bible. Please keep Shpresa in prayer not only for these events and activities but also for her health. At her last doctor's appointment, we found out that Shpresa has a potentially dangerous bacteria (Group B Strep). It is fairly common to have and does not always pass on to the baby, but the potential is there. Please pray for both her and the baby to remain safe and for wisdom for our doctor here to treat this well not only now but especially when it is time to deliver the baby.


