I will be very brief this month in the interest of sharing an article from someone else with you at the request of our Deacons.



What Is and Is Not Congregational Transformation?

What *is* congregational transformation?

1. It is an ongoing spiritual and strategic journey.
2. It is about reaching the full kingdom potential of a congregation in response to God's call.
3. It is about building an enduring visionary leadership community as carriers of the vision of the congregation.
4. It is about allowing God's call to pull the congregation forward into the future.
5. It is a deep long-term solution.
6. It is an affirmation of past, present, and future generations of people.
7. It is a process of continual transformation that acknowledges the dynamic nature of congregational life.
8. It is about the transition of people in relationship to God and one another before changing programs, ministries, and activities.
9. It is about re-imagining a congregation in the image of God.
10. It is about soaring with the God-inspired strengths present within the gifts, skills, and preference of the congregational participants.

What *is not* congregational transformation?

1. It is not a one-time destination that allows a congregation to say they are finished with transformation.
2. It is not about extending current trends into the future.
3. It is not about focusing around the vision that is only held by the pastor, or expecting the pastor to provide vision.
4. It is not about seeking to push the congregation forward into the future through established objectives, goals, and action plans.
5. It is not a surface short-term fix.
6. It is not an affirmation of only past generations of people.
7. It is not transformation that assumes once a congregation is transformed that they will never have to transform again.
8. It is not about changing programs, ministries, and activities that challenge people to transition in response.
9. It is not about re-imagining a congregation in the image of the program, project, or process used to bring about change.
10. It is not about focusing on fixing the problems or weaknesses in a congregation in the hope that it will magically soar when these are gone.

So, what is congregational transformation?

Congregational transformation is an ongoing spiritual and strategic journey that empowers congregations to travel in the direction of their unique full kingdom potential in response to God's call that is expressed through a captivating vision for future ministry championed by an enduring visionary leadership community.

Family Ministry

What is the principal purpose of the church? Why in the world do we band together in the name of Christ? Ask ten Christians that question and you'll likely get ten different answers. Some will say the purpose of the church is to disciple believers. Others will say that the church's purpose is to go and spread the good news of Christ. Still, others will say that the church is a refuge from the world.

I wonder what we would say if we are willing to be honest. Would we say that it's a place to go to remember the way things used to be; the last stronghold of sanity in a changing world? Would we say that it's a place we go to feel comfortable? Would we say the church is where I see my friends? Certainly, none of those are wrong. But are they really what Jesus' church is supposed to be?

Every child in our Sunday School classes can tell you that the church is not a place or a building. It's people; the body of believers of Jesus. It's not a clubhouse. It's not a fort in which we hide from the world. It's certainly not a place we go to get what we want. It is the family of Jesus; nothing more and nothing less.

Just about everyone can agree that a principal purpose of the church is to WORSHIP. We have set aside a large part of our building so that we can gather together as God's people and worship Him together. We worship Jesus everyday in everything we do; not just one or two hours each week. But, we meet together to worship Him and encourage each other. Paul even exhorts us not to stop the practice of gathering together. We may think we can worship just as well in the woods or on the golf course, but we need each other. If not, why would the church exist?

So, what's the big deal? People all over the world gather together to worship. Unfortunately, we bring lots of baggage with us. We bring our expectations about what worship is going to be. We bring our agendas of how others should behave. We bring anger about what we don't like. We bring our personal opinions and preferences. Unfortunately, we often bring everything except a heart longing to worship our God and Savior.

We too often come ready to criticize the sermon. We may not like the message. We may question the preacher's motives. We regularly forget (conveniently) that we are hearing a message put on the heart of the speaker. We criticize what the Holy Spirit has inspired.

Some of us come DEMANDING a certain type of music and a particular way of expression. Again, we refuse to allow the Holy Spirit to breathe fresh wind in our worship. I want to tell you, my church family, that is a dangerous thing. You place yourself in great spiritual peril when you stand between God and a worshiper.

People worship God in different ways. Some lift their hands in praise, as Paul exhorted (not commanded) the church in 1 Timothy 2:8 (David in Ps.88:9). Some express worship by weeping. Some close their eyes in prayer as they sing. Some kneel. Some sit silently in the presence of God. Worship may be a corporate event, but expressed many ways by individuals. It HAS to be that way. It is an intimate act between the worshiper and God.

Are you really worshipping God or just keeping a tradition of coming to church? Do you find yourself watching other people worship and becoming angry? Do you accuse other worshipers of "putting on a show?" Do you accuse others of being too sinful to worship? Do you become angry when a different style of worship music is part of the service? If so, then it's time to ask if you are really worshipping or just simply trying to control the worship of others. God will not allow anyone to control his church. IT BELONGS TO HIM.

Remember this: it's not all about you. It's about Jesus! It's not about the way you like, it's about worshipping. It's not about tradition, it's about the living God! There is no such thing as sacred or secular music. Music is neutral. It's the substance of the lyrics that are sacred or secular.

Above all, church, let's never lose sight of the fact that YOU ARE NOT THE AUDIENCE; GOD IS. You are the worshiper. Let's don't waste a second of our time questioning the way the person beside us worships. Let's question our own heart. That's part of real worship.

Choral Response

I can **DO ALL THINGS** = Satan so often tries to tell us we are too small, our gifts too ineffective for God to use. Remember the little boy with the five loaves and two fish? His lunch was so small when compared to the need, 5000 hungry people. Yet in the hands of Jesus, those 5 loaves and 2 fish fed everyone with food left over. Can you imagine the eyes of that small boy as he watched Jesus reach into his lunch bag again and again and again, over and over as HE pulled out piece after piece of bread and fish?!! In God's hands our small gifts become multiplied many times over. Just by making ourselves available, offering our selves and our lives to God's mighty power we find we can DO ALL THINGS.

I can do all things **THROUGH CHRIST** = "Look Lord, I know I can't do this. I've tried before and I messed up! I can't, and that's that!!" True we can't, but the scripture states "I can do all things through Christ." Let HIM do the work. Give yourself into his hands and let Him work through you. Balaam's sweet donkey couldn't talk either, but Numbers Chapter 22 tells us that not only did he talk, but also exactly what he had to say. Give yourself to God. Let Him Work through you.

I can do all things through Christ **WHO STRENGTHENS ME**. = It is Christ Who is working, Christ Who provides the power, Christ Who is responsible for the outcome. We worry about results, about the "what ifs" and the "I should haves" when it is all HIS responsibility. HE just asks us to be available; to open ourselves to HIS Power. IF GOD CALLS...HE WILL PROVIDE.

Each of us as members of the BODY OF CHRIST has been blessed with a talent, a gift, a special task that has been specifically designed for us. God could very easily fulfill His purposes without us; He made the world without our input, but He wants our involvement. Remember how proud you feel when your child demonstrates a new skill, "Show Auntie Kim how you blow kisses. Show Uncle Rob your model car." GOD also wants the pleasure of seeing us grow and accomplish for HIM.

Make yourself available, BELIEVE God's words. Satan tries so very hard to knock us down, but tell him flat out, I CAN DO ALL THINGS THROUGH CHRIST WHO STRENGTHENS ME, then live like you believe it. Let God clean all the smudges from your lamp and then let your light shine for HIM. HE lights the wick, He supplies the oil; all we have to do is make our lamps, our lives, available to His Touch.

The 4-H Division of the Cooperative Extension Service had a need and asked the Master Gardeners to help out with 20 raised bed gardens. Each garden would be four feet wide, eight feet long and eight inches deep. Avron Upchurch, being a master gardener, asked his Sunday School class if they would volunteer for the task. As always, the mission-minded men of JHBC responded and gave 55 man hours to this project. They worked with fifth grade students and their parents. The gardens will be used in teaching selected fifth grade students and their parents how to select, plant and care for vegetables, the nutritional value of vegetable and food preparations. Our thanks to these men for reaching out beyond the church to assist others.
