FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE . . .

You're probably reading this issue of the *Announcer* during Holy Week, the week leading up to Easter and the celebration of our Lord's resurrection.

We have several important opportunities this week to remember and celebrate what Christ has done for us through his death on the cross and his resurrection. Our Jonesboro Community Good Friday Service will meet at Shallow Well Church at 7:00 P.M. as we gather with our brothers and sisters from other churches to remember Christ's Passion. Easter Sunday morning, the annual Sanford Sunrise Service will be held at Buffalo Cemetery at 7:00 A.M. And we will worship the risen Lord here at JHBC in our morning services at 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m., with Communion in both services. Don't miss any of these opportunities to remember and celebrate!

During this special week, we remember how Jesus rode into Jerusalem as the royal Son of David to shouts of praise on Sunday, only to be rejected by the Jewish leaders, falsely accused by them, turned over to the Romans, and crucified on Friday. But we also remember that his crucifixion was not the end; for on Easter Sunday we celebrate our Lord's glorious resurrection!

Holy Week—Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday—reminds us that we can't simply go from the royal entry to the resurrection without going through the Upper Room, the Garden of Gethsemane, the trials before the Sanhedrin and the Roman governor Pontius Pilate, and to the cross on Golgotha.


Or to put it the way one of my teachers often has, you can't have resurrection until somebody dies.

When Jesus first began to teach his disciples what was going to happen to him, they didn't get it (Mark 8:27-38). He asked them who people were saying that he was. They replied that some were saying he was John the Baptist or Elijah or one of the other prophets. Then he asked them point blank, "But you, who do *you* say that I am?" And Peter responded, "You are the Messiah!"

And then Jesus began to teach them that he had to suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes (all the religious leaders of the Jews) and be killed and after three days rise again. Peter took him aside and told him that wasn't how it was supposed to be. Jesus responded to Peter by saying, "Get behind me, Satan, for you're not thinking God's thoughts, but human thoughts."

Then Jesus called the crowds to him along with his disciples and told them, "If anyone wants to follow after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me."

In other words, Jesus said, "Here's where I'm going and how I will get there—suffering, rejection, death, *then* resurrection! If you want to follow me, it's the same for you; you have to follow me in the way of denying yourself and dying to yourself and the world, in order to follow me to resurrection."



FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE . . . (Continued)

We want resurrection, but we don't want how you get there. We want to share in his glory, to live eternally, but we don't want to share in his sufferings. Isn't it interesting that in Philippians 3:10-11 as Paul is talking about knowing Christ, he says, "I want to know him and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being conformed to his death, if somehow I might attain to the resurrection from the dead." Paul knew that we experience Christ's resurrection power *now*, since as he said in Ephesians 1 and 2, God is working in believers' lives now *with the same power that he used to raise Jesus from the dead*. We were dead in our trespasses and sins, but he has made us alive in Jesus Christ through his marvelous grace and by his resurrection power. But Paul was also looking for the resurrection at the last day, when our salvation is brought to its full completion in the resurrection of our bodies when Christ returns in glory. We don't know everything about what our resurrection bodies will be like, but we do know that they will be like Jesus' resurrection body, and that they will be fitted for the eternal realm, not subject to disease or decline or disability or death or decay!

I've always loved Easter and the hope of resurrection. It's our highest and holiest day as Christians. The hope of resurrection has become more and more precious to me through the years as I have presided when the mortal remains of so many saints were laid to rest.

In his song "Embrace the Cross," Steve Green sings:

Embrace the life that comes from dying,
Come trace the steps the Savior walked for you.
An empty tomb concludes Golgotha's sorrow!
Endure then, till tomorrow, your cross of suffering.
Embrace the cross, embrace the cross,
The cross of Jesus.

Remember that Jesus not only said, "Deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow me"; he also said, "Because I live, you also will live." Remembering his suffering and death. Celebrate his resurrection. And experience his hope, even in the midst of whatever trials you may be facing.

Family Ministry



There are many things that churches do well; and many things they don't do well. Larry the Cable Guy (Git 'er done!) often says, "I don't care who you are, that's funny!" Well, I don't care who you are, but you'll have to admit that churches are really good at having committees and meetings. We have it down to a science.

Some things most churches don't do very well are thinking, imagining, and remembering. It's probably because we're too busy doing everything else we do... like having meetings. (OK, that's just a joke!)

Every successful organization has a way to evaluate what it is doing. Many have mission statements to measure against. Others simply sit down and ask the question that Dr. Phil loves so much: "Is what we're doing working? Is it taking us where we need to go?" Those are tough questions that the church needs to ask on a regular basis. If what we are doing is not getting us where we need to be going, we have to start using our imaginations. We encourage children to imagine things, but we don't think it's very important for us to imagine.

Christians desperately need to rediscover imagination. "What if...?" needs to become central to our lives. I find myself asking that question often during the most quiet time of my day, my drive to the office. What if I REALLY took Jesus seriously? What would my life look like? What would others see in me that would make them want to know more about Jesus? What if we were less concerned about what WE think the church needs to do and more concerned about where God is leading us?

That, church, is where remembering comes in! We remember everything that's ever happened in the church. We remember all sorts of things, some important and some not. But, we constantly forget who we are and what we are called to be.

Since I came to JHBC, I've been so busy doing the small things I need to do that I've often forgotten what God called me here to do. Family Ministry is such a new thing for most churches that very few have any real understanding of what it is. Truthfully, most people think Family Minister is a two-for-the-price-of-one deal; a combination Youth pastor and Children's pastor. Most churches are perfectly willing to settle for that. To be honest, why wouldn't they? My answer would be that it's because the church and the family have forgotten who they are.

My paradigm scripture for my ministry here at JHBC is Deuteronomy 6: 4-7.

"Hear O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your soul, and with all your might. And these words which I command you this day shall be upon your heart; and you shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise."

Moses was passing on God's not so subtle warning that the people were in danger of forgetting what God had done for them. Future generations might enjoy the pleasures of the land they had been promised, but forget how everything came to be. You and I can read that passage and flip over, squeeze it, analyze, and probe it every possible way and won't be able to escape the clear message. The responsibility for the spiritual education of children lies primarily with the parents and secondarily with the community of faith. Every Jewish family understood that. God made it their priority.

It is only in the last few decades that the church has taken over that responsibility. Whatever the reason for that (and there are many), the church has become the primary source of discipleship for children and youth. Parents, anxious for their children to be involved in something good and positive, began to drop their children off at the church, even if they weren't themselves interested.

There are many statistics to quantify the results of that trend. Most children (about 80%) graduate from high school, go off to college, and lose connection with any church. Most high school graduates who have grown up in church, have little basic knowledge of the Bible or Christianity. So, as Dr. Phil would ask, "How's that working for you?" Is that good enough?

Family Ministry - Continued



You can't imagine how often parents come up and tell me about their children's grades, sports achievements, or musical talents. Last week in my Sunday School class, though, Theresa Smith told us about the time that Ariane really came to understand Jesus. She and Ken were thrilled because, "That was our greatest hope for her." Frankly, I don't hear that very often. We, as parents, often forget what is most important.

My vision for Family Ministry at JHBC suggests that there is a better way: God's way. Instead of turning the responsibility for our children's discipleship to one or two professionals for an hour or so each week, WHAT IF the church partnered with parents; equipping them to carry out God's command in Deut. 6? WHAT IF JHBC shifted its focus toward making the family central to its mission?

The church (and certainly not me) doesn't know more than you do about parenting your children. God, however, knows exactly how we should build up our children to know and love Him. One of the studies I read stated that less than 20% of parents say that their church has ever helped them to be more effective parents.

I want to say as humbly as I know how, that I believe there is a better way. It's neither frightening nor burdensome. It certainly is not just another program. It should be the most exciting thing parents have heard! We can learn together how to create a faith community of families that build mature, faithful followers of Jesus.

I don't recall asking much of anyone during my time here at JHBC. So now, if I have any credit built up at all, I'm going to ask something of you.

May 16th will be Children's Sunday at JHBC. The children will participate in the worship service. I will be speaking that Sunday. I'm asking every parent and grandparent of our children and youth to be present that Sunday. I've never counted myself as being much of a preacher, but God seems to trust me with his message. So, that Sunday I'm going to speak more about what the Bible has to say about the discipleship of our children. This message is not just for parents. It's for the whole JHBC family. I'm not sure I've ever been as certain of what God would have me to say. Please be there with your children or grandchildren. There is too much at stake!



Deacons Corner

Starting this month, the Fellowship of Deacons will begin to provide regular updates on our work in 3 key focus areas – **Family Ministry, Congregational Health,** and the church's **3 Year Strategic Plan.** We hope this will provide increased transparency into the deacons' activities and allow everyone to more easily connect to our continual spiritual transformation.

So that equal focus would be placed on each focus area, we created 3 deacon teams. Each team has a deacon member from each of the 3 elected deacon classes so that continuity of the work could be maintained from year to year as new deacons are elected.

Our **Family Ministry** deacon team is comprised of Phil Lawrence, Dallas Harper and Tim Smith. After much discussion with our Associate Pastor to Families, Rev. Mike Clements, the Family Ministry deacon team decided to sponsor and start a small group ministry at Jonesboro Heights Baptist Church. The small group ministry will focus on building strong relationships between groups of 8 -12 individuals through Christ-centered discipleship, prayer and service in confidential, relaxed meeting settings. To date, the Fellowship of Deacons has started 2 small groups and has hopes to multiply the number of small groups in the second half of 2010 so that anyone desiring to be a part of a small group can find one that fits their needs.

The second focus area is **Congregational Health.** The Congregational Health deacon team includes Johnny Whiteside, Sam Wornom, and John Hall. To date, the team has investigated ways to receive regular feedback from the church on activities and direction. We hope to have a feedback mechanism in place before the summer. We will also begin looking at trends in the attendance of our church services, tithing and demographics of our congregation in order to identify opportunities for continued spiritual growth.

The third focus area is developing the church's **3 Year Strategic Plan.** The deacon team leading this effort includes Jeff Brown, Bob Tilley, and Lynwood Jones. Since December the staff has presented to the deacons the 3 year strategic plans for worship, family ministry, church operations, missions and outreach, and music and education. These plans outline the general direction of our church in these areas. In the coming weeks we hope to compile and share our work with the congregation.

The Fellowship of Deacons is pleased with the progress to date in these 3 key areas and is excited to see God opening doors to new ways of fulfilling His mission and vision for Jonesboro Heights Baptist Church.
