Dear friends, first let me say how much I miss you. I sincerely do! I miss you throughout the week as so many of you drop by to say hello. I miss you on Wednesday evenings as we pray and study Scripture, and sometimes share life and laughter. I miss you at the front door of the church as we have a brief moment to get caught up. And I especially miss the blessing of worshipping with you on Sunday mornings! But, this will pass and we will be together again before you know it. And perhaps the silver lining is that we will appreciate each other all the more and be a closer family because of it.

Well, these truly are strange times. Sandy and I were watching TV last night and saw three women break into a fist fight over toilet paper. What's going on!? Worship Notes from Scott

In recent days during my personal devotional time, I have been making my way through the book of Matthew. I just finished reading chapter 13, which includes the well-known passage of the Parable of the Sower. How many times have I read this? Perhaps dozens. How many sermons have I heard preached from this passage? Likely a handful or two. Is there more to be gained from reading it again? Most definitely.

One of the distinct benefits and purposes of the Spirit of God is that as you read His Word, the Spirit mysteriously draws your mind to certain words, meanings, and interpretations of the passage that uniquely apply to you (and me). That's always been an amazement to me, how multiple people can read the same passage, the same story, yet come away with an application unique and distinct to each of them, yet always fully true and consistent with the message and person of God.

I have to admit, my understanding of this passage this morning absolutely is shaped by my recent and ongoing battle with a certain portion of my yard that I have goals of developing into a luscious, beautiful sea of the greenest grass ever to be cultivated on planet earth. And that's saying something for a guy who grew up in Iowa, the home of some of the richest, most fertile soil in the world.

The background. My yard is largely surrounded by mature trees, which obviously shaped the decision of the previous owners of the property to simply either just let the leaves of the trees provide the ground cover, or to cover every bit of the sandy soil with mulch. My plan has been that this spring I would bring in a truckload of good topsoil to level everything out, and in the few areas that get an acceptable amount of sun to either seed, or likely sod it with a type of grass that can tolerate a good bit of shade. The struggle in this is that in the meantime, there are some nasty weeds that continue to make themselves at home there. I have attempted to remove them both my chemical means and sheer hard work with a shovel and sweat. But, unsurprisingly, they have returned again as the weather is getting nicer and the time for my project is drawing nearer.

That draws me to Matthew 13. A short synopsis. The parable identifies four types of soil and the resulting success of the sower in each of these areas. First, there was the path, a hard-packed area where the seeds were quickly snatched up by the birds before they had a chance to grow. Second, the shallow, rocky soil provided no protection from the hot sun, and the young plants were quickly scorched and withered away. Thirdly, some seeds fell among thorns, and as they grew, they were choked out and produced nothing. And lastly were the seeds that fell on fertile soil, and they thrived and produced a rich crop.

Jesus's explanation makes it clear that the seed was not different in each of these situations, but it was the condition of the soil, or perhaps the heart, that determined whether the gospel was able to take root and flourish. But I have wondered, what if the soil (heart), dense from years of neglect, was tilled, and what if the rocks of hard-heartedness and criticism were removed from the rocky area, allowing the seed's roots to sink deep into the soil. And what if the weedy temptations and worldly influences were removed and instead replaced by godly encouragement? What if all these areas were cultivated by the practice of joyful worship and Christian fellowship and spiritual growth? Then even what had been thought to be unfertile, unlikely, and unreasonable places to expect to see return, could be transformed into desirable and rewarding areas of fruit-bearing growth.

I am not giving up on my weed-ridden soil. I will invest time, energy, and yes, even money in hopes of turning it into something that is capable of sustained growth. I will do the same for my own heart, also investing time, energy, and yes, even money to make sure it is capable of reproducing the seed of the gospel, and spreading it wherever I go. Will you join me in doing the same?
