PS 103:1 Bless the LORD, O my soul, And all that is within me, bless His holy name.

Last week I accidentally came across a Christian group called *Maverick City Music* – they have quickly become one of my favorites. One of their songs is entitled '*Move Your Heart*.' The song begins...

I just wanna move Your heart, it's all I wanna do. I just wanna stand in awe and pour my love on You. No matter how much the cost, I freely give it all to You, Oh, Jesus.

What a beautiful desire! I was instantly reminded of the Psalmist who burst out; **Bless the LORD, O my soul**, and all that is within me. I didn't really understand that Psalm as a young Christian. That's probably because, at first my relationship with God was more likely centered about prayers for things, to meet my needs and the needs of those I cared about. Later I began to understand what the Psalmist cries out; may everything within me, about me, be a blessing to the heart of God! May my life bring YOU Father, great joy and pleasure!

But, even as beautiful as that desire is, it's not what caught my attention in the song. In the song, the singer asks of God, 'Tell me what moves You, Lord.' And then the singer offers the answer, 'YOU do. YOU move the heart of God.' The musician goes on to describe the many 'YOU's' — 'YOU when you begin to sing. You, without the performance. You, the authentic you. You, when you are just who you are meant to be.' And I was tracking with every word and praising God...but then the musician continues with the 'YOU's'...

"... You without the talent. You who haven't prayed in a while. You who just got the divorce. YOU move the heart of God." And I had to stop and ask the question... is that right? It didn't seem right. God hates divorce – it says so right in the Scripture. He longs for us to meet Him in prayer. He has given us gifts and talents to use. Don't we move the heart of God when we... you know, DO the right things? Doesn't He love us more when we... behave right?

There is a supernatural spectrum described throughout the words of Jesus and the New Testament. On one side of the spectrum we have Paul, the spokesman for the GRACE of God and on the other side we have James, the spokesman for WORKS. Likely many of us struggle with a healthy balance between the two; thanking God for His amazing grace, and out of that grace, doing the works God has given us to refine us and expand His kingdom. But as I listened to that song I realized that I had unconsciously lost my balance and slid to the side of works; God will love me more if I ______. Fill in the blank, or better yet, don't bother.

Because this does not represent God's perfect and unconditional love that does not change based on our performance – God just loves. Sure, He has prepared a good path for us to walk, and it hurts His heart when we stray from it – because it hurts His children. But it doesn't change His love. Surely, that's worthy to sing about! And clearly, I needed a reminder.

What moves the heart of God? **YOU do**. 'Is it a fragrance? Then I pour my oil out. Is it a life laid down? Then here I give my vows. 'Cause I live to move You. Father, we live to move You.' May this be our desire as well.

He Lives!

Easter is a powerful time in the life of a Christian. This celebration provides us the opportunity to be reminded and consider again the amazing thing that God has done for us. For me, the images of the cross and the empty tomb are powerful reminders of the length God would (did) go to pay for my sins (with the life of His one and only Son). I remember as a young man that for quite a few years I wore a cross necklace, not as a fashion statement, as it sometimes seems it has become, but as that reminder I talked about. I thought just not long ago whether I might want to do that again. I, personally, believe that times are going to get tougher for believers in the coming years, and something to help keep me centered on Jesus could only be a good thing.

I am excited as I have prepared for Easter this year, though it has been a different kind of challenge. Typically, I would have identified a number of compelling Choir songs with powerful messages, memorable melodies, and great part-writing. I love leading our Choir in beautiful choral music. But with no Choir right now, that was pretty much out of the question. Then, plans changed and the decision was made to move the service outside with the intent of reaching farther into our community than we might with our service (typically) inside. This is an exciting venture! I am praying that the 1,500 postcards that went to homes surrounding the church are used by God and the power of His Sprit to move individuals and families to come join us for our Easter celebration. On that day, I pray that we will see folks from all ethnicities come to celebrate with us. I pray that whatever barriers that have prevented them from coming before will be broken down, and that they feel welcome and loved. I am also praying for good weather, like many of you have been as well.

So, as I looked for the music I wanted to use in the service, I came across a great song from a church I had never heard of. The song is called "He Lives", by Church of the City. When I first saw the title I wondered if it might have a connection to the old hymn of the same name. It didn't take long to figure out that it didn't. But I was immediately captivated by the imagery the words created and the vertical focus on Jesus and what His work on the cross has done for us.

The song begins by painting the picture of the tomb with the stone rolled away, declaring "He is risen! He is risen!". We are then reminded of Thomas's doubt, then faith, with "See His hands, see His feet, touch His scars and believe." You can see, for a guy who like others, when picking up a book, checks to see if there are any pictures in it, I am immediately drawn into this story in song. The chorus is powerful and simple, saying, "He lives. All honor and glory are His. All glory forever, amen." The second verse continues the imagery of redemption, followed by more.

The song goes on, but I will hold off on laying it all out for you now. You are welcome to go on YouTube and find the song yourself. The title of the video I watched is "He Lives (feat. Chris McClarney) Church of the City". My intention is to open our Easter service with it as our Worship Prelude. I believe it sets the stage beautifully for what we have come to celebrate, a service to declare the love and power of God, reaching down to us unworthy and unrighteous people, and through the sacrifice of Jesus, we can be made both worthy and righteous.

I hope you will plan to be there, and I hope you will be praying for God to do wonderful and magnificent things in all who come. See you on Easter, Resurrection Day!
